Chuck Fort, Cruising Chair

For some of the upcoming marina cruises, here is some information that might be useful.

The Labor Day 4-Day Cruise will have one night at Zahnisers Marina on September 3rd. Because Zahnisers uses Dockwa for reservations and payment, we ask that skippers go to Zahnisers website, make their own reservation, and pay for the slip as soon as possible. If you need to cancel, you can get a full refund from Dockwa if done at least 72 hours ahead of time. Skippers can submit for reimbursement for their slip if they have at least one crew from the coordination. Zahnisers website is https://shmarinas.com/locations/safe-harbor-zahnisers

Oktoberfest will be held at Anchorage Marina in Baltimore September 24th. Anchorage Marina is another marina that uses Dockwa for reservations and payment. We ask that skippers go to Anchorage Marina's website, make their own reservation, and pay for the slip as soon as possible. If you need to cancel, you can get a full refund from Dockwa if done at least 72 hours ahead of time. Skippers can submit for reimbursement for their slip if they

have at least one crew from the coordination. Anchorage Marina's website is https://www.anchoragemarina.com/boat-slip-rentals-baltimore If you add your BoatUS number when registering a Dockwa account, you will be able to get \$0.10 off per foot when making reservations.

The last weekend cruise of the season will be the **Oysterfest** at CBMM. This will be a 3-day weekend, sailing to St. Michaels on Friday, staying for two nights, and returning home on Sunday. You have to have a CBMM membership of at least Mariner level to get a slip there. Go to https://cbmm.org/visit/docking/ and click on the tab Make a Docking Reservation on September 28, one month before the Friday of Oysterfest weekend to make your reservation. If you don't have a CBBM membership at the Mariner level or higher, you can make a reservation next door at Higgins Yacht Yard at https://higginsyachtyard.com/marina

For the Oysterfest, skippers pay for your slips at either marina, and then submit for reimbursement if you have taken crew offered by the coordination.

ELECTION OF NEW DIRECTORS

On September 15th you will receive an email with a link to the anonymous online ballot to elect the Board of Directors. Online voting closes at midnight on September 30th.

Members who do not have a valid email address will be mailed a paper ballot so you may vote. These ballots must be postmarked October 1st. You may vote for up to FIVE people.

Voting for more than **FIVE** will invalidate your ballot. Read more about the candidates on pages 8-11.

Results will be announced by October 15th in an email from the Commodore.

Fitness for Sailors

Susan Zevin

In last month's Whisker Pole, Safety Chair Joan Tannen reminded all of us to be fit for sailing, and to ensure that, as crew, we are responsible to let our skippers know of our physical capabilities and drawbacks.

All of us have such limitations and strengths. Sometimes we have injuries that temporarily limit our sailing skills; and normally our strengths and mobility decline with age. It is a part of life. To be physically fit for sailing we need some basic skills—balance, coordination, agility, strength, flexibility, and cardiovascular health. Here are some easy basic activities we all can do to stay ready for the call to be crew.

- **1. Balance**—practice standing on one foot for 10 seconds; stand on the other foot for 10 seconds. When you can accomplish this, try standing on one foot and touch the floor and returning to standing.
- 2. Coordination—Toss a tennis ball back and forth from one hand to another. When you can do this, stand with one foot in front of the other (heel touching the toe of the other foot) and toss the ball in the air.
- 3. Agility—hop scotch down the sidewalk
- **4. Strength**—Stand up and sit down in an armless straight chair. Do not use your hands. Or, with your back against a wall, feet 1 ft from the wall, bend your knees and squat down. Make sure your weight is on your heels, not on your toes. Hold for 5 seconds and return to standing. Do this 5 times. When you are ready, increase your squat time to 10 seconds. For your upper body, do slanted push-ups against the kitchen sink, or against a wall.
- **5. Flexibility**—lay on your back and pull your knees to your chest, or pull one at a time. Also, lay on your back with one leg straight in the air. Put a towel around your elevated foot and gently tug your straight leg toward you. Repeat with your other leg.
- **6. Cardiovascular health**—WALK, WALK, WALK. Uptempo! Find a hill and walk up and down. Or walk fast past five telephone poles, turnaround, and return to your starting pole. The least you should be able to do is walk one mile within 30 minutes.

Walter Bortz is a famous PhD, Professor Emeritus at Stanford University, a legend in the arena of fitness for our later years. His book "Dare to Be 100," is a prescription for staying healthy and fit as we age. When people say they are too old to get fit, he says "It is never too late to start; it is always too early to stop." Let's Dare to Be Fit Sailors!

Sup, Garbage Man

Joe Wright has picked over 4300 cubic feet of trash out of the rivers surrounding the Chesapeake Bay on his stand-up paddleboard alone. That's just over an entire 18-wheelersemitruck-bed full of one man's trash consciousness. Wright began standup paddleboarding (SUP for short) regularly in 2019. Loading the board onto his truck for a paddle before work or over the weekend, he found himself always picking up whatever trash floated by. It wasn't long before he set off with a little more organization-a milk crate and plastic trash picker. He'd paddle along while simultaneously picking up trash. Then, he upgraded to a laundry basket. Before long the bins became amphibious, the pickers multiple, with gloves and sorting containers, and then hauling it all back for further reuse, recycle, or proper disposal on land. Then, he started a nonprofit under the name SUP Garbage Man so that he could accept donations and sponsors, which had already started rolling in. He launched his website supgarbageman.org and social media. It is in no way a full-time gig, but that doesn't mean Wright doesn't dream of it someday being that way. "Who knows," he said. "A garbage truck painted colors I can travel with and paddleboard doing clean up campaigns on the coast." Or, perhaps it evolves to Wright promoting campaigns that teach people and recreational SUP and kayak companies how to autonomously clean up trash. Maybe one day he could have an employee as a coordinator, but for now it's a one-man show. Well, two, if you count his wife, who goes by Mrs. SUPgarbageman on social media. But Wright doesn't want to organize much further beyond that. It was always intended to be somewhat of a solo, anonymous mission that proved "Introverts can go out and change the world all on our own."

Wright lives somewhere near the Potomac River; he's originally from somewhere else in Florida. Up until recently he never shared his name, and he still tries not to share his face—



choosing to cover it with a buff in published pictures. He doesn't tell what he does for a day job, or where he stands on any political or social or personality spectrum. All he stands on is his paddleboard and the platform that one person's recreational hobby can make a huge environmental impact. And if everyone did that, the effects could be colossal. So why not take the image one step further?

Imagine this: it's 10 years from now and every self-propelled watercraft comes with basic, built-in trash collecting systems. The weekend paddleboarders, kayakers, fulltime cruisers in dinghies, even bicyclists, walkers, and runners are all equipped with the means to pick up at least some trash while doing recreational activities. Some of the systems are autonomous and more expensive, while others are basic. All are supported for your average income and average person. Every landing and beach are equipped with large disposal systems that get emptied, and all trash is then properly disposed of far from the waterways. While this may sound like a utopian future where personal and social responsibility overlaps apathy on a whole, Wright is already an example that one person doing a recreational activity can simultaneously make an impact. "It was always my intention to keep it anonymous and hands on while putting in the work, and to show people they can make a difference doing whatever they like to do," he said. "For me it's paddleboarding. I look at this project as a marathon, not a sprint- and I'm not sure what it might look like one day."
