SPRING TRAINING IS HERE AGAIN ON APRIL 6th By Jean Gough

Once again Singles on Sailboats brings a full day of educational sailing programs with Spring Training on Saturday, April 6th at the Anne Arundel Community College campus in Arnold, Maryland from 8:00 – 4:30. FOLLOWED BY – the AFTER PARTY at O’Loughlin’s Restaurant ... See details below.

Our 2024 Spring Training Team has put together a full program of sailing experts to engage all levels of sailors as you’ll see on the Spring Training Curriculum on pages 14-15.

The registration price includes a continental breakfast, a full lunch, and all classroom materials.

There are five “time tracks” and six “presentation choices” per track. You choose one presentation per track. Each presentation is tailored to a specific level of sailing experience. The three levels of training are designated as – “L”= limited to no sailing experience, “M”- moderate experience, “E” = experienced sailors or Skippers. Please see the Registration Instructions on pages 11-13 for more details.

For our long-term members, who have been enjoying Spring Training for several years, we are pleased to share that we also focused on offering brand new presentations. This resulted in eight new topics that had not been offered before. That’s more than 25% BRAND NEW PRESENTATIONS and speakers!

The Spring Training team also received requests to add more General Interest (GEN) presentations, which we are delighted to say has resulted in at least one GEN presentation in each of the five “time tracks”.

Class selections offer various topics such as sail trim, navigation, safety, docking, boat maintenance, anchoring, cooking on board, and much, much more. The general interest topics (GEN) include Lighthouses of the Chesapeake Bay, Early Chesapeake Bay History, and a first-hand account of a journey from England to Maryland in 1634.

Some of the sessions will include hands-on activities with the intent to have fun while learning new skills. What you will learn at SOS Spring Training 2024 will help make you a better sailor for Spring, Summer and Fall cruising!

A word of advice – sign up early because seating is limited in many of the seminars and workshops and the most popular topics fill up early. We look forward to seeing you there!

DON’T FORGET to plan on attending - The SPRING TRAINING AFTER PARTY - once again held at O’Loughlin’s Restaurant at 1258 Bay Dale Drive, just a short drive from the community college. O’Loughlin’s is delighted to have us back and has asked that we provide a headcount to

make sure they are adequately staffed so that they can arrange the right space for us. **So please take an extra moment to register for this separately... see Fleet Exercises.**

There is no cost to attend the AFTER PARTY, other than the cost of your drinks and food. The registration request is simply to give them a head count in advance, so they are not “suddenly slammed” with 40+ new patrons without time to prepare.

SOS Wellness Protocol

All participants attending SOS in-person events should be feeling well. They should not attend an event if they have symptoms of a communicable respiratory or gastrointestinal illness, are “feeling like something is coming on”, have a recent significant exposure to someone with a communicable respiratory or gastrointestinal illness, or have not waited a recommended isolation time after a recent respiratory or gastrointestinal infection (for COVID this would be 10 days from your first symptoms or positive test).

In addition, a skipper/host may have further requirements or request other preventive measures (for example, crew or guests having received the currently recommended COVID-19 vaccine or wearing masks when below deck).”

Membership renewal and retention: From Oct. 1, 2022, to Sept 30, 2023, 69 people joined SOS. To date, 23 of that group have renewed their membership for 2024, a rate of 30%.

Education: Jean Gough - Spring Training: 30 total Classes, 30 Confirmed Speakers, 11 NEW Presentations, 17 SOS Speakers, 12 non-SOS Speakers. Special Project from Dec 2 Board Retreat: Volunteer LINKS KISS Project – How Can I Support or Volunteer for SOS? KISS descriptions and links to volunteer opportunities will be finalized with Teresa Scofield's help.

First Mates: Lora Donia - Reviewing and updating the First Mate Advisory Chair's job description. First Mate Weekend Training cruise has been scheduled for July. Working on Whisker Pole article to promote the First Mate program and to recruit First Mate Candidates.

Membership: Pat Tracey, Gail Williams - Seven new members joined SOS in January. Survey sent to new members on January 24. SOS flyers being distributed for advertising at local Marinas.

Newsletter: Shirley Brooks - The 20-page February Whisker Pole was mailed to 54 members and 25 copies to Happy Hour coordinators at a cost of \$647.28 which equals to \$8.19 for each printed copy.

Public Relations: Karl Scible, Janet Gonski - Focused efforts to create advertising/get the word out for Spring Training include ad postcards, articles for the Spin Sheet, looking for other media outlets, and creating an Event on Meet Up.

Safety: Joan Tannen - The Fire Department has asked us to reduce the number of attendees at CPR and First Aid training to 20, down from 30 in the past. Almost all volunteers are lined up for Flare and Safety Day. The Dinghy Dance has been moved to July 21. Seeking new volunteers to eventually take a leadership role in CPR training and Flare and Safety, as well as a volunteer to help with newsletter articles. Preparing to start the boat activation process.

Skippers Advisory: Sandy Rosswork- Plans are being made for a skipper mentor program and for several ways to meet and engage with our new skippers. Many thanks to Bill Small, who has stepped down after many years of overseeing and monitoring the Skippers io Chat Group. Chuck Fort has volunteered to assume the duties of owner and moderator of the group. One new skipper has joined thus far in January, and one prospective skipper member attended the Annapolis Happy Hour.

Social: Janet Pennewell - Will be requesting RSVPs for O'Loughlin's following Spring Training Day. Arrangements continuing for DNR, Anniversary Party, and Seafood Feast cruise parties. Working to broaden Social Committee participation and reduce party expenses.

Old Business: A 30-day grace period for membership renewals (to 1 March) was adopted. Need to learn why people do not renew. Several folks volunteered to make calls.

A discussion of photo profile choices was led by Shirley Brooks and Bob Wright. 51 members have indicated in their profiles on the SOS website that they do not wish to appear in photos, requiring a lot of time to compare each photo submitted against this list to determine if we can use it. The consensus was to simplify the question to yes or no, and just for the Whiskerpole. Shirley will talk to John McDonald to implement on website.

Discussion of Member Participation Policy concerned the limiting of participation by married members as a form of discrimination. Current policy is not a legal problem (in any event, SOS is a Social Club), but feels internally inconsistent with our claims we don't otherwise discriminate (re race, religion, etc). Michelle will propose new wording...

Training in CPR/AED and First Aid for Mariners Saturday, March 2, 2024

By popular demand, we are again holding this important training session before the season begins to help us learn these important skills.



The Annapolis Fire Department emergency medical personnel will conduct this hands-on class on CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation), the use of the Automated External Defibrillator (AED), and first aid with a special focus on mariners. The training will be held at the Taylor Avenue Fire Station in Annapolis.

Because SOS recognizes the value of this American Heart Association certified training, the club pays half the cost. Whether you are learning these techniques for the first time, or recertifying, there is always more to learn. Recommended procedures are always being updated. Certifications are valid for two years.

The class will start at 9:00 AM and run to approximately 3:00 PM. Your cost is \$48.00, which includes coffee and a light breakfast, as well as lunch. Be sure to sign up early because we must limit attendance to twenty.

It is a great chance to meet people who may live near you; we will especially assist hosts in reaching out to newer members.

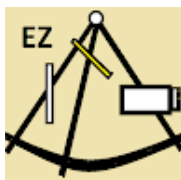

Seminar EZ Sextant App March 23rd



Use your smartphone to learn how to navigate in open waters without a GPS, sextant, or internet connection. The EZ Sextant app uses the phone's camera to make celestial sightings and automatically plots the results for easy navigation. Use it as a GPS backup or in conjunction with your sextant to take advantage of the built-in almanac and plotting tools. Perfect for those who have a sextant but forgot the details in making a sighting.

Mike and Janet Novey, sailors and developers of the app, will provide an overview of the EZ Sextant smartphone app and what led to its development. They will also brush lightly on celestial navigation, GPS, and the need for a non-GPS backup when sailing in open waters. The app will be demonstrated, and participants will be allowed to try it out on several phones.

You will meet on various SOS boats to learn and practice the skills needed to sail, simulating an SOS cruise, but not leaving the dock. (Sometimes if the weather is good and the boat is ready, you may go out for a sail.)

Skippers and First Mates will conduct standard pre-cruise and safety briefings and provide hands-on training.

Dockside Training is designed to answer such questions as: What tasks does the crew perform on a boat? How do I tie a clove hitch or stopper knot? What am I expected to do when leaving the dock? And more.

After you register, you will be notified by email regarding your boat/skipper assignment. Just pack your water bottle, picnic lunch, and Basic Skills form(s). Then head to your assigned SOS boat for an afternoon of fun, camaraderie, and learning.

Flare and Safety Day, Saturday, April 27 9:00 am – 11:00 am



The Sailing Season must be right around the corner because it's time for our annual Flare and Safety Day!

This outdoor, fun, hands-on experience allows members to go from station to station practicing hands-on safety skills.

Have you ever used a fire extinguisher or fire blanket to put out a small fire? Have you ever lit a hand-held flare or shot off an aerial flare? These are just some of the skills you'll be able to practice!

In addition, you'll be able to "walk through" the use of a passing line to enter a raft-up, practice the mechanics of setting an anchor, reinforce how to use a winch safely,

practice tossing a line from one person to another, etc.

SOS Member Participation Policy

Singles on Sailboats is a private, non-profit club, whose operations are controlled by the membership, and whose facilities and activities are only open to members and their guests. Married members are welcome to remain in the club as Associate members (see By-Laws Article VIII, 1(b)).

Singles on Sailboats, Inc., strives for equal participant opportunities for all members and is committed to providing a healthy and safe social environment free of discrimination. We respect, honor and value diversity in an inclusive community. SOS does not discriminate against any members based on race, religion, sex, or age .

Sexual advances; physical conduct of a sexual nature; sexual or racial jokes; racial, ethnic, national origin, or disability slurs; and other language or conduct that is meant to intimidate or that negatively impacts a member's participation or sailing environment is considered harassment and is strictly prohibited. Verbal, physical, sexual or any other form of harassment that belittles or demeans any individual is strictly prohibited. Prohibited harassment also includes conduct that has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with a member's performance, participation or experience or creating an environment that is hostile, intimidating or offensive.

This policy applies to every member no matter his or her authority or position in the club. Violators of this policy are subject to investigation and discipline including, but not limited to, termination.

When Discrimination or Harassment is Experienced or Suspected: If a member or members feel they have been harassed or discriminated against, they are encouraged to report it immediately to the Commodore or Vice Commodore. If a member knows of or suspects harassment or discrimination against another person, they are urged to report it to the Commodore, Vice Commodore or Commodore's Appointee. Complainants' wishes for confidentiality will be honored; their identity will be protected for filing any complaint of harassment or discrimination or assisting in an investigation of discrimination. If these avenues of reporting are not satisfactory to the complainant, then the complainant(s) may direct their concerns to another member of the Board.

Singles on Sailboats, will investigate credible allegations of harassment or discrimination. Also, Singles on Sailboats may use third parties to assist in such investigations. All members or their guests have a responsibility to cooperate fully in any investigation. Finally, any member who makes a knowingly false claim may be subject to discipline at the discretion of the Board.

This policy is posted on the SOS web site. During the annual renewal process members will acknowledge receipt of the current Participant policy.

New SOS Wellness Protocol

All participants attending SOS in-person events should be feeling well. They should not attend an event if they have symptoms of a communicable respiratory or gastrointestinal illness, are “feeling like something is coming on”, have a recent significant exposure to someone with a communicable respiratory or gastrointestinal illness, or have not waited a recommended isolation time after a recent respiratory or gastrointestinal infection (for COVID this would be 10 days from your first symptoms or positive test).

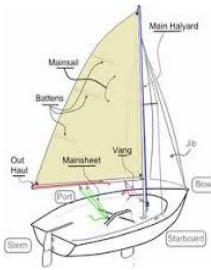

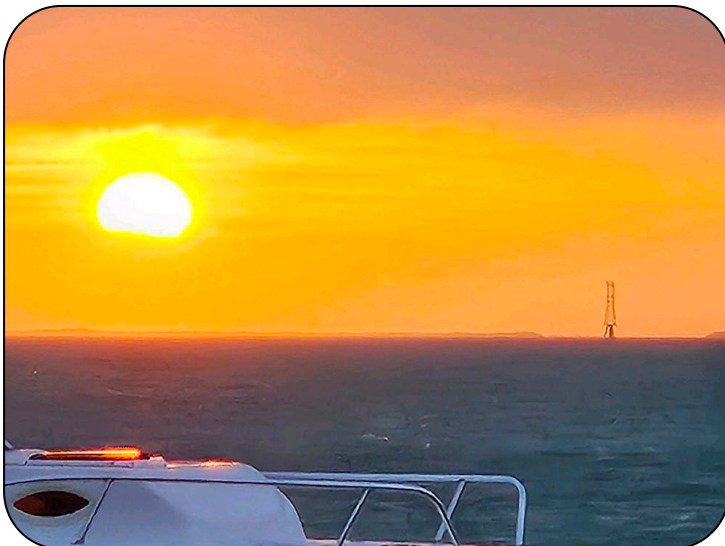

AHOY SKIPPERS

Why should you join SOSskippers@groups.io? It is for SOS skippers and run by SOS skippers.

SOSskippers@groups.io is an official means of communication among SOS skippers. To participate, you must be a skipper in SOS, on the BOD, or Chair of the Cruising, Safety, or First Mates Advisory Committee.

To become a member of this group and have questions, contact Chuck Fort, sailrn@comcast.net and ask to be invited to join. You may also go to groups.io and follow the instructions to join. Either way, be sure to use the email address in your profile in the SOS online directory or one that clearly identifies you. This is needed to allow those handling approvals to know that you meet the criteria for group membership.

AHOY CREW

The SOS io group is the official online communication for SOS members, providing a convenient way for discussion of various sailing related topics. It is also a tool skippers can use to recruit crew for an impromptu day of sailing or to request a boat helper. Need to arrange a carpool to an SOS party – this is a good way to reach out to members. Here are the *very simple* steps for you to join the SOS email group.

STEP 1 - Get a groups.io account

1.1 In a browser, go to <http://groups.io> and click Sign Up in the upper right corner. Follow the directions to register an account email (use the one you get SOS email at).

1.2 In your email, look for the "Verify your account" email and click the link to verify you are the owner of the email address you registered with.

STEP 2 - Connect to the SOS group

2.1 In a browser, go to <http://sos.groups.io> and click the blue "Apply for Membership In This Group" button near the button.

2.2 Wait until a moderator okay's your subscription (the moderator will first verify that you are an SOS member, based on your email used to subscribe). You will know this is done when you get an email welcoming you to the group. Read that email, then browse to the site <http://sos.groups.io>.

STEP 3 - Optional - Join one or more subgroups.

3.1 On the main SOS page on the left is "Subgroups". Click that. From the list of subgroups, click one that you are interested in. Read the description and if you want, the Message History of that subgroup. If you want to join the conversation and get an email when someone posts there, go to 3.2

3.2 On the main subgroup page, click "+Join This Group" near the bottom. You will be automatically added to the Subgroup.
