It is official – autumn arrived on September 23rd, and with it came the promise of some great sailing!

This summer did not bring us very many 90+ degree days, but it also did not bring us winds to enjoy the kind of sailing that gives us that longed for feeling of exhilaration. Although we don't know what the weather gods have in store for us in the upcoming weeks, what we do know is that there is still time to enjoy weekend cruises and day sails through the end of October. Now that the leaves are beginning their spectacular color show, turning to brilliant shades of yellow, orange, and red, take time to get out on our beautiful Bay to witness and enjoy this yearly phenomenon.

While we anticipated fewer boats on the water in September as a result of the French Canal Trip, we nevertheless had a fantastic time stateside, singing along to the music of *Them Eastport Oyster Boys and Friends* when they were in Shaw Bay for **Shawlapalooza**, **September 6-7**. Seven boats arrived after a misty motor sail and were treated to a spectacular sunset. We finished off the day with a karaoke sing-along in Harness Creek on the **Let 'Em Eat Cake Cruise**, **September 13-14**.

Tall Ships and Navy ships from points north and south arrived in Baltimore for the 200th Anniversary of the Star Spangled Banner. The possibility of catching sight of them was probably responsible for the higher than usual number of skippers and crew who registered for the **Mid-Week Sail, September 10**. Four other Day Sails in September offered additional sailing opportunities.

Five SOS boats raced in the **Hospice Cup Race**, **September 20**, in the Hospice Cup Class: Emil Becker (Coney Island), Jon Bernheimer (Propice), Harry Keith (Analysis), Dennis Krizek (Sea Tango), and Robin Meigel (Pacem). At the time of writing this, the race results were not known, so stay tuned.

The crew on each boat heading to the Wye East for the Chili Cook-Off Cruise, October 4-5 will appoint one 'master chef' who will prepare his or her version of chili.

The origin of this mixture of meat, beans, peppers, and spices may well go back to the Incas, Aztecs, and Mayan Indians. After the raft is secure, the Master of Ceremonies, Dennis Krizek, will announce the time for the taste-testing and judging to begin. Prizes will be awarded!

Columbus Day Cruise, October 11-12-13, is the last of the 3 day weekend cruises this year, and will offer a split destination: sail with the wind to the northern destination, the Sassafras River, or to the southern destination, Hunting Creek off the Miles River. A Fun Race is planned for day 2 for boats heading out of the Miles River and down Eastern Bay on their way to the Skipper's choice for the 2nd night. A rendezvous is planned for 1100 hours in the vicinity of Eastern Bay RN "8" north of St Michaels. Either Grays Inn Creek or the Corsica, both off the Chester River, will be the destination for the **Goose Cruise**, **October 25-26**. This has always been a very popular SOS cruise, so let's hope that lots of skippers will have lots of berths available for lots of crew that are expected to register. We do not want to disappoint the Canada geese who are waiting to welcome us! Picture it – crisp fall weather, good wind for sailing, a circle raft (hopefully), pumpkin soup, and hot spiced cider – all the ingredients for a great weekend on the Bay.

No less important to members of the club are the day sails, and there are 2 Mid-Week Sails 10/8, and 10/16 as well as 2 Weekend Day Sails on 10/18 and 10/19. Please



note that the Mid-Week Sail, October 16 is on a Thursday so that you can watch the start of The Great Chesapeake Schooner Race just south of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge. This magnificent gathering of schooners will begin their 127 nm adventure down the Chesapeake at 1300 hours. What a great way to top off the Mid-Week Sails this year!

Unofficial notes from September 4, 2014 Board Meeting

Official August minutes will be posted on the SOS web site when approved in October by the Board of Directors.

Commodore: the Amendment to the Articles of Incorporation, approved by the Board of Directors at the July 2014 Board meeting, was filed with the State of Maryland.

Vice Commodore: The Vice Commodore was added to the checking account and has a limited number of checks that can be used in the case of emergency or in the absence of the Treasurer.

Treasurer: An analysis of dues paid for the last 5 years and a projection of Life Time Members was presented to help determine the fee for dues in 2015.

Ad Hoc: Cookbook project on hold until after the France Trip is complete.

Bareboat The Windwards trip has been announced and sign-ups are well underway. Ann Ashton is the coordinator for both a windjammer trip and also a bareboat cruise out of Maine in July/August 2015; sign-ups will open ASAP. A proposal to change distribution of the Bareboat admin fee was presented and passed with 1/3 going to escrow, 1/3 to treasurer, 1/3 refund to participants.

Brunches: Carole Jordan and Shirley Franco approved as Chairs. Venues for Brunches have been secured.

Cruising: As of August 24th, there have been 9 Mid-Week and 14 Weekend Day Sails resulting in 58 boat days, 6 first mate days, 160 crew days. There have been 10 Weekend Cruises, 1 Extended Cruise, and 1 First Mates Cruise resulting in 410 boat days, 100 first mate days, and 902 crew days.

Database: The election committee will be Teresa Scofield, Debra Roane and Linda Casucci.

Education: Kris Smith has agreed to chair the Seminar Committee and is locating a new site because the Edgewater library is not available. Still need chairs for Fireside Chats, BBQ Chats, and Spring Training.

First Mates: No report. Kitty St. Romain was approved as First Mate Emeritus.

Membership Recruitment: Board asked for details to be presented about the \$4,000 budget request for next year.

Membership Retention: The Membership survey results data will be posted on web, not including comments that were received from membership. The "Honing My Skills" tab has not been updated to reflect descriptions for Spring Training, Dockside Training and Flare and Safety Training for 2015 as requested.

Newsletter: Ninety-eight copies of the September 20-page Whisker Pole were mailed to 77 members and 20 issues to Happy Hour coordinators at a printing and postage cost of \$373.21. The cost per issue was \$3.85.

Safety. No report.

Skippers Advisory: Brian Guptil was approved as Skipper Emeritus.

Social: The Regional Thanksgiving dinners will be coordinated by Kitty St. Romain and the After Parade of Lights party will be coordinated by Barbara Mistrik. The Awards Banquet is scheduled for January 31 at the Sheraton.

DOUBLE HEADER IN MAINE!

Schooner or Bareboat – late August 2015

Option 1. Take a Schooner trip in Maine. The Schooner Victory Chimes will sail August 16-21, 2015. This is a five day cruise along the beautiful coast of Maine, leaving from Rockland, Maine. The boat takes 35 passengers at a per person cost of \$915. This price includes all meals. The schooner has captain and crew but passengers are more than welcome to assist.

Victory Chimes has 132 feet of deck space with outside cabins offering portholes and hot and cold running water. Some cabins accommodate two while others have multiple bunks. There are four suites with double beds and toilet en suite as well as hot and cold running water. They serve wonderful food. You can see a more detailed description at their web site: www.VictoryChimes.com.

Option 2. Do a Bareboat Charter with Johanson Boats, also located in Rockland Maine, during August 22-29, 2015. This charter would be seven days going from Saturday to Saturday or Sunday to Sunday. Johanson offers 10 boats for charter ranging in price from \$2400 to \$5000 per week. The per person cost will be approximately \$760. Final cost can be determined once the skippers have chosen the boat they wish to captain and how many crew are on each one. The larger boats charter for \$3000 to \$3500 per week and can carry up to 7 people. As in all other bareboat charters, skipper and crew supply their own food and drink. You can find a description of the various boats available for charter at their website: [Jboatworks.com].

Members can either choose to drive to Maine or to fly into either Portland or Bangor and rent a car, or take a bus. They will responsible for their own transportation. Application forms may be found on the SOS website under "forms and such" or under the "Bareboat Cruising" tab. A deposit of \$300 is required to sign up for either of these trips.




