If we continue to practice mask wearing and social distancing, I believe we may have a full sailing season. With that in mind, we are planning a number of events for this Spring.

May 1 - Spring Training at Sandy Point State Park. (See registration details in Fleet Exercises.)

We will have a number of small group (10 people) sessions providing hands on training while maintaining social distance. Topics may include (but not limited to):



Notice of General Membership ZOOM Meeting April 8th

All members are invited to attend a General Membership meeting on April 8th, via ZOOM. The link will be sent to the entire membership shortly before the meeting.

As directed by our bylaws, the Treasurer will provide a budget update and overview, and each committee chair and/or their board liaison will share a summary of the 2020

year's highlights and a look ahead to 2021. Questions from the membership are requested prior to the meeting.

Below are the minutes from the previous General Membership meeting held via ZOOM on August 16th. These will be voted for approval at the commencement of the April meeting.

Minutes from Town Hall General Membership Meeting – August 16, 2020



The Town Hall meeting was held under COVID restrictions with a limit of 50 people in actual attendance and 27 people joining remotely on ZOOM.

Commodore Sandy Rosswork reported that it had been a difficult sailing season with all of the COVID restrictions at the State and local levels but that SOS had a couple of in-person events and many educational and happy hours held remotely on ZOOM. The Board meetings had also been held remotely on ZOOM. She also reported that we were seeking a new Brunch chair because Carol Jordan had resigned.

Due to concerns about the corona virus and travel restrictions, the Alsace Lorrain Barge Cruise has been postponed until the Fall of 2021. There is a picnic on August 26, 2020 limited to 50 people. Commodore Rosswork thanked Andy Katz, Sharon Taylor and Dana Stoffregen for their work started under the Long-Range Planning Committee under Former Commodore Strandberg to review the bylaws and policies. She also thanked Lorraine Fassett and her committee this year for their work on the dues revision, a difficult prospect for the club.

Treasurer Teresa Scofield reported that we had approximately \$40,000 in operating expenses since so many of our functions had been canceled. Last year's were over \$70,000 by this time. We spent approximately \$600 on insurance, \$4500 on lockers, and \$3000 on web hosting. The Town Hall meeting approximately \$3000. There will be a review of the financials by a professional for approximately \$3000. There was a suggestion that the review of the financials could be done by a committee of the club.

Jan Warfield, Vice Commodore, presented Laura Gwinn and Irene Aronian their engraved Jefferson Cup Awards at Town Hall because they missed receiving them at the Awards Ceremony at SASSY. Laura received the Ed Kline Member of the Year Award and Irene received the Elinor Abramson Education Award. Vice Commodore is still holding three awards following awardees: for the Krushinskie and Andy Katz were both well-deserved Rookies of the Year. Dave Henkin was a co-recipient with Irene Aronian for the Elinor Abramson Education Award. The Vice Commodore is also still holding the Elinor Abramson and Rookie plagues. Unless an awardee wants a plaque, the plaques will be put in the high-end storage locker.

The nominating Committee chaired by Laura Gwinn presented the five candidates for the five Board of Director positions, Wendy Adams, Robin Meigel, Pat Woodie, Heidi Harper and Craig Coltharp and they each gave a speech and position statement.

Dana Stoffregen reported that the bylaws revision to allow for electronic meetings had passed. His Long-Range Planning Subcommittee on Documents and Policies has completed his comprehensive review and the Club will consider some of those revisions in the vote on the dues change policy. Additional revisions and typographical errors will be presented for a vote later this year. Some of the polices recommended and adopted by the Board this year include a no harassment policy, conflict-of-interest policy and a document retention policy.

There was then a discussion of the two dues/bylaw changes such that lifetime members pay dues less than regular members and to allow certain members to take an inactive status for a slight fee such \$20 receive tο electronic communications but not attend functions unless attending as the general public or a guest of a member. Lorraine Fassett, Chair the Dues Restructuring of Committee, pointed out that this was not a lack of recognition of the contribution of lifetime members but a recognition of our declining membership and financial realities.

The dues change was needed to ensure the club survived and was financially solvent. Although the Board would make the final decision as to the actual dues, depending upon the finances and the budget, there was general discussion of dues with examples such as \$60 for regular members and \$40 for lifetime members with \$20 dues suggested for inactive members. Debra Roane, former Commodore and a member of the dues restructuring committee, had done a financial analysis which supported these fees, taking into account our reserves, our expenses and the declining membership.

Many questions as to expenses and rational of this change were discussed although many of the issues had been addressed in the General Membership ZOOM meeting held in June, 2020. The answers to questions raised during that meeting, along with the minutes from the ZOOM meeting, were posted on the Website.


