December 5th Brunch Pirates of the Chesapeake: From the Colonial Era to the Oyster Wars

In her new book, *Pirates of the Chesapeake Bay*, Ms. Goodall introduces infamous men like Edward "Blackbeard" Teach and "Black Sam" Bellamy, and lesser known figures whose tales of piracy are legendary from the harbor of Baltimore to the Shores of Cape Charles, Virginia.

The story of Chesapeake pirates begins with a land dispute and ends with the untimely death of an oyster dredger at the hands of the Maryland Oyster Navy. From the 1650s during the golden age of piracy to the 1730s Confederate privateers and oyster pirates, the maritime communities of the Chesapeake Bay are intimately tied to a fascinating history of intrigue, plunder and illicit commerce raiding. Chesapeake residents looked to smugglers, pirates, merchants and local government officials to bypass trading obstacles in order to meet their demands for affordable manufactured goods from Europe and the Caribbean.

From the Elizabethan Sea Dogs to the so-called golden age of piracy, commerce raiders maintained a prominent place in people's imaginations. Pirates mainly operated on the open seas, but they were known to make use of rivers and land to support their operations. Join us for this fascinating presentation of Pirates of the Chesapeake Bay and meet many characters of that period.

Jamie L.H. Goodall, Ph.D., is a staff historian at the U.S. Army Center of Military History in Washington, D.C. She also teaches at Southern New Hampshire University in their on-line program. Professionally she wears many hats having taught at several other universities, has many published articles including *National Geographic*. Additionally, she served as a reviewer for both the 2021 Harriet Tubman Prize Reader's Committee and the Discovery Grant for the National Endowment for the Humanities.

January 9th Brunch *Waterborne*, the Result of a 14-year Circumnavigation of the World

Marguerite Welch and her husband Mike will share their adventures sailing the world in their 38" Shannon Cutter *Ithaca* and talk about her recently published book *Waterborne: A slow trip around a small planet.* It is the story of an artist, an engineer and a Labrador—three entirely different personalities—who abandon a stable middle-age lifestyle for a pitching deck and the possibility of pirates.

Challenged by culture clashes, gear failure and sudden storms, the story of their 14-year adventure is as much a sea saga as travel memoir.

There are still some star struck nights on the boat when I look up at the sky, study the compass, listen to garbled voices on the VHF and wonder if we were really gone for 14 years? Was it just a dream, that world that only exists in my mind now-my memories, my heart? It's as if I made it all up but I didn't. It's a fact that after thirty-three vears of marriage, two careers for "Michael", two sons and many reincarnations of me, we abandoned everything and everyone we loved to explore the world in a small boat for fourteen years. "Why?" you might ask. "Why not?" I might reply."

Marguerite is a writer, photographer, teacher and sailor whose eclectic tastes and interests have often led her in unexpected directions. Her passion for the photographic image and its history led her back to writing. She became a critic and commentator for numerous art publications.

Mike Welch is a retired Navy Captain, graduate of the Naval Academy Class of 1961, fighter pilot and test pilot. Duty stations included Commanding Officer of Patuxent River Naval Air Station and Executive Officer of the USS America. After 30 years in the Navy and eight years with ARINC, he retired as the V.P. of Advanced Technology and Engineering.

COVID VACCINATION REQUIRED AT SOS EVENTS

An unvaccinated member may attend an indoor SOS event by presenting a negative COVID 19 test taken within the past 72 hours.

You Ought to be in Pictures: The 2021 SOS Photo Contest

Have you taken **stellar shots** of this year's SOS activities? If so, keep on shooting! If not, start taking photos to be submitted to the 2020 Photo Contest.

1. Entries must be taken at events with other SOS members in 2020 by the member of SOS submitting the photo. Note: If you are in the photo, you <u>cannot</u> have been the photographer and your submission will not be accepted (unless on a tripod with a timer, which is acceptable). A photo does not necessarily have that event as a theme (a picture of Annie Anchorage at a raft-up or the sunset seen from a raft-up is acceptable, even though there is nothing in the picture to prove that it was taken at a raft-up or cruise.) We are on the "Honor System". An SOS event can be cruising, day-sail, a brunch, seminar, destination cruise, shore party, etc. Happy Hours are <u>not included</u>.

2. Each photo **must** identify at which SOS event it was taken and the name of the photographer.

3. This is an amateur photographer contest. Professional photographers - i.e. anyone who earns more than 50 percent of his or her annual income from photography – are excluded from the contest.

4. Each member may submit up to a **total of eight (8) photos**. The photographs should be submitted in a 5" x 7" format or the coordinator will crop it for you.

5. Photos may **NOT** be edited to achieve color balance that reflects the scene as you observed it. Heavily manipulated photos are **not** eligible. Cropping is the only acceptable edit. We ask the photographer to 'Suggest' a category, but the Judge has the discretion to change the category.

Categories: People, Bay scenes (including sunsets), Sailboats (sailboats under sail, raft-ups), and Destination

Cruises. The Destination Cruises category includes photos taken during the actual SOS destination cruises and photos taken on days when traveling prior to or after a destination cruise, provided the photos are from the same area. (A destination cruise of the Mediterranean mav not include photos from а layover in Amsterdam.)



Other Useful information: Submit your photos in digital format. Send photos attached to emails, Drop Box or contact Bob Wright for instructions to upload the Photo Editor's Google drive. Submit photos in high resolution. The photos will be enlarged to 5" x 7" (and larger to project to a screen). If the photo is fuzzy, it reduces your chance of winning. Photos not submitted in the 5" x 7" format will be cropped to that format. Smart phone photos may be submitted. Please select high resolution for photos in your smart phone setup.

Judging: The Photo Contest Manager and Judge may put your photos in the best applicable category. There will be First, Second and Third Place Awards for each of the four categories and also a Grand Prize Award. The photos will be judged by a greater Annapolis area professional photographer from outside the club. The judging will be blind, so the Judge will not know which photographer took which photograph. The Judge may add a fourth-place award in any category, if deemed necessary due to the quantity and quality of entries in a category (<u>not to exceed</u> <u>a total of 13 awards</u> including the Grand Prize Photograph).



The Maryland Department of Natural Resources' exciting Clean Marina Initiative offers marina and boatyard operators, and recreational boaters the opportunity to participate in efforts to protect Maryland's natural resources.

The Maryland Clean Marina Initiative recognizes and promotes marinas, boatyards and yacht clubs of any size that meet legal requirements and voluntarily adopt pollution prevention practices. The department has certified nearly 25 percent of Maryland's estimated 600 marinas as Clean Marinas or Clean Marina Partners and we aim to continue increasing this number

moving forward. Boaters are encouraged to patronize certified Clean Marinas and to adopt clean boating habits.

The collective effort of individuals and businesses will improve the quality of Maryland's waters from Deep Creek Lake, to the Chesapeake Bay, to the coastal bays!
