Spring Training, April 1st Anne Arundel Community College

In early April, the temperatures might still be low, and more than a bit of snow might still be lingering, but the sun is staying around in the late afternoon. The body clock screams, "sailing time, sailing time".

To prepare for sailing, we are excited to announce that Spring Training will have a diverse line up of 30 sessions. Starting with breakfast and opening remarks from our Commodore Carole Jordan, we then have six tracks from which you may choose five sessions based on your interest and skill level. Each session is identified with a **L** (Low experience in sailing), **M** (Moderate experience) or **E** (Experienced or skippers.). In the morning the sessions are 50 minutes long and after lunch the afternoon sessions are an hour and 20 minutes.

Examples of **L** sessions are Introduction to SOS, Basic Sailing Terminology and Basic Sailing Knots. If you are a new member, these are designed for you. For people with moderate experience, we have ABC's of Cooking Aboard, Docking and Boat Handling Under Power and Basics of Rafting, to name a few. If you are a skipper or have extensive experience such as first mates, sessions such as Celestial Navigation, Diesel Engines and Boat Electric Systems will expand your knowledge. Look

for the Spring Training Matrix on pages 10-11 of this newsletter for the full list of sessions.

Due to the impact of Covid on food prices, we have had to raise the price a little bit over last year, keeping the increase to less than 10%. Prices are member early bird: \$85; after March 1st member \$95 and non-member & walk in \$100.

Brunch – April 2nd Jahn Tihansky: Everglades Challenge, Retrospective, and General Meeting



Join us for Brunch at the Annapolis Doubletree Inn to hear Jahn Tihansky, head of the U.S. Naval Academy's Offshore Sailing Team, discuss how he won the Everglades Challenge which is a 300-mile expedition style adventure race for kayaks, canoes, and small boats, from Tampa to Key Largo.

Sailing on *Spawn* with Jeff Linton and OH Rodgers, Team Twobeers finished the challenge in an

unprecedented 37 hours and 36 minutes. "Spawn" is the result of two years of tweaking to create the perfect boat that would crush the challenge. Spawn is a modified custom-built OH Rodgers with a broken Melges 20 mast, an A-cat boom, bowsprit, and rudders. "Rodgers is a composite guy," says Tihansky, "and he put it together. With a plywood hull, the boat weighs just over 550 pounds."

Also, at this Brunch we will view the **2022 Retrospective** – a review of the SOS year through photographs, and announce the **Photo Contest** winners.

Following the brunch all are invited to attend a **General Membership meeting.** As directed by our bylaws, the Treasurer will provide a budget update and overview, and each committee chair and/or their board liaison will share a summary of the 2022 year's highlights and a look ahead to 2023.

Cruising Corner

Chuck Fort, Cruising Chair



As we prepare for the upcoming cruising season, I wanted to review some information regarding the cost of sailing with Singles on Sailboats.

The cost per day for sailing has gone up by \$2 – so a daysail will cost \$19 when you register, and a typical weekend will cost \$38 when registering. The last time the cost per day increased was in 2013. The costs for coordination, other cruising committees' activities, and the needs of other committees that cruising supports have increased.

Refunds for sailing activities will be issued in the following instances [AMENDED 10/18]:

- Member cancels before a deadline (an administrative/credit card fee will be deducted).
- Member cancels after deadline and coordinator places another person (an administrative/credit card fee will be deducted).
- Skipper cancels and the member is not placed on another boat (full refund for cruise is issued).
- In the case of a cruise/party, party fees cannot be refunded after the caterer's deadline; member may choose to drive into the party.
- In the case of a cruise/party, member must cancel his/her party reservation before caterer's deadline if not attending or driving into the party.
- Member is not placed on a boat/lack of available berths (full refund for cruise is issued).
- Cruise is cancelled by Cruising Committee Chair or designee (full refund for cruise only is issued).

Hopefully there will enough boats available this year so that crew are not left ashore, and the weather cooperates so that sails are not cancelled.

March 4th Raft Captain Training

Learn how SOS builds linear and circle rafts, including where and how to set an anchor, place fenders, secure lines, approach in the wind, and effectively communicate both on the boat and with the Raft Captain.

This seminar is designed for Raft Captains, potential Raft Captains, Skippers, First Mates, and all Crewmembers. The session covers considerations involved in raft building such as advance planning, general guidelines for all rafts, special considerations for circle and linear rafts, handling emergencies, docking for land-based cruises, and ways in which Skippers and Crew can assist the rafting process. There is no cost for Raft Captains, potential Raft Captains, First Mates and First Mate Candidates. Online signup.

- 1. Never heard of SOS First Mates (FM) or what they do. The First Mate Program supports Cruising by supplying sailors who assist both skippers and crew on cruises and day sails. The stated purpose is: "A First Mate should have the ability, should the necessity arise, to act competently as a skipper and to return a boat and crew safely to shore."
- **2. I am not sure my skills are good enough**. You never know if you don't try! Our club website provides detailed information on skills. You can see the FM Self-evaluation form, you can ask others, you can take classes in sailing, you can practice. The FM Advisory Committee will support you along the way. Practice! Practice! Practice!
- 3. Are there any benefits to being a FM? You sail free when you are sailing as FM assigned by a cruise coordinator! You will gain experience and strengthen your skills by sailing on a variety of boats with different skippers. You can participate on the First Mates Cruise June 17-18 and the FM party in the spring. You will be recognized as a skilled sailor. You will meet other FMs. You will have the opportunity to assist others, including performing the Basic Skill Checkout Levels 1-111. And much more. FMs are an important segment of SOS.
- **4. I am too new to the club and don't know enough members.** Being a FM is a wonderful way to meet club members, both plain old crew and skippers. The more you sail the more members you will get to know.

CPR/AED Training & First Aid for Mariners Saturday, March 11



Once again, we are holding this important training session before the season begins to give more instruction on safety. The

Annapolis Fire Department emergency medical personnel will this conduct class on **CPR** (cardiopulmonary resuscitation), the use of the Automated External Defibrillator (AED), and first aid with a special focus on mariners. training will be held at the Taylor Avenue Fire Station in Annapolis.

Because SOS recognizes the value of these important skills, the club pays half the cost of this American Heart Association certified training. Whether you are learning these techniques for the first time, or recertifying, there is always more to learn. Recommended procedures alwavs being updated. are Certifications are valid for two years.

The class will start at 9:00 AM and run to approximately 4:00 PM. Your cost is \$48.00, which includes coffee and a light breakfast, as well as lunch. Attendees are required to be fully COVID vaccinated and boosted. The deadline for registration is March 4. New SOS Sailing Fitness Assessment Program

Over the last year some skippers have suggested it would be helpful for safety purposes to have additional information on crew members relating to their "Sailing Fitness." This refers to a member's physical ability to perform certain sailing tasks.

A committee was assembled about half a year ago to address this issue. Our purpose was to develop a system that would capture information that would allow skippers to invite a balanced crew to sail on their boats and to divide typical sailing tasks. This is similar to the way we ask members to provide information on their Sailing Experience. A skipper might not want to have all crew members that are inexperienced or that have a low Sailing Fitness level. Similarly, they might not need all crew members who are very experienced and can physically handle all sailing tasks. We would like to have good balance on all boats.



Starting this spring season, when members register for a sail, they will be asked to do a self-assessment on their Sailing Fitness. Six fitness levels will be provided where members are asked to select the level that best describes them considering the sailing activities listed. As these six fitness levels range from one to six, the tasks described are a little more challenging.

A member's assessment on where they fall in these six Sailing Fitness levels might vary throughout the season, and certainly through the years; if they pull a muscle in their back, are recovering from surgery, or have been working to improve their fitness. So, it's important for members to review their self-assessment for accuracy each time they register for a sail and make any appropriate changes.

To go along with this new Sailing Fitness assessment program, the club plans to provide some information on techniques club members might use to help improve their Sailing Fitness. Two such sessions were held on recent Friday Zoom sessions held by the Education Committee. Those sessions were recorded and are available to view on our web site under "Presentation." Another Fitness session will be held at Spring Training.

We hope you will welcome this new safety program that has been developed to support club members. Looking forward to seeing everyone out on the water for our upcoming sailing season!
