It is almost time to start sailing another season! Reach out to your favorite Skipper and offer assistance in getting their boat ready. Spring Training is April 1st and you would be a fool not to go. The Cruising Kickoff will be held Saturday April 22 for invited Skippers, 1st Mates, and Coordinators to plan for the upcoming season. The Flare and Safety Day will be held at Camp Letts on the morning of April 30. There will be Dockside Training all day on April 29 and on the afternoon of April 30. Dockside Training is an opportunity to learn on a Skipper's boat the basics of sailing with Singles on Sailboats, and to get your Basic Skills 1 signed off in preparation for the upcoming sailing season.

The Extended Cruise this year is going up the bay. It will start DNR Cruise weekend with a party at the Wye Island DNR facility. The DNR Cruise is Saturday and Sunday, but some boats (and people driving in) arrive on Friday to help with the party preparations and enjoy a potluck barbecue Friday night. Well, SOS and our wonderful volunteers have planned some April activities to make sure you are ready for the great sailing season that Cruising Chair Chuck Fort and his team have prepared for us.

Don't miss the opportunity to upgrade your safety skills for the season. Joan Tannen and her team have prepared the annual Flare and Safety demonstrations with the opportunity for you to launch flares, learn how an anchor really works, practice with a passing line, and many more skills to make us all safer.

That same weekend is the Dockside Training days; an opportunity to go for a short sail and practice all that you have learned on a BOAT!! A must for newer sailors but valuable for all!

Our fantastic crew of cruise coordinators are attending the Cruising Kick-off this month also. This is designed for skippers, first mates, and the folks that organize the cruises (the coordinators). Did you know that the coordinators manage all the requests to sail (from you) and try to match you up with skippers who are planning to sail for that event? It is a monumental task, but they have managed to do this for us for many years.

For this reason, I have always advised you to sign up early!

The earlier the sign up, the better your chances of being offered to the skippers as crew members. Once you sign up online, the coordinator makes the effort to match you with a skipper in your geographic area, considering your skill level and your fitness level. It is a monumental task, but one they do willingly.

What happens if you can't make the sail once you have been invited to sail with a skipper? The coordinator attempts to replace you on that boat with another crew member, if possible. If he/she is successful, then you will get a refund of your fees. Of course, you are refunded your fees also if the sail is cancelled, either by the club (for weather) or by the skipper. Please check your calendars and circle the sails that you want to attend and "sign up early"!

Here's to a fabulous sailing season.... I will see you on the water!

Bareboat – Simplesite needs to be updated. The site was migrated to new vendor and capabilities. We are still working to figure out some of the functionality. -San Juan Islands: August 26, 2023 – September 2, 2023. Coordinator: Heidi Harper -BVI: Spring 2024 Coordinator: Lynn Winkler. Considerations for fall 2024 include the Great Lakes.

Brunch – April 2nd Speaker Jahn Tihansky "Sailing Adventures through the Everglades". There will also be a general meeting, photo retrospective and contest.

Cruising - In coordination with Skippers Advisory and Education, the Raft Captain Class will be held on March 4th and will include information regarding positioning of powerboats and catamarans in circle rafts, and the safe use of generators for cooking in SOS rafts. The Coordination Manual is under revision. Coordinators for the 2023 season are being recruited for daysails and weekend cruises. The Cruising Kickoff is scheduled for April 22 at the Doubletree Annapolis.

Flare & Safety Day Sunday, April 30



The Sailing Season must be right around the corner because it's time for our annual Flare and Safety Day! This outdoor, fun, hands-on experience allows members to go from station to station practicing some safety skills.

Have you ever used a fire extinguisher or fire blanket to put out a fire? Have you ever lit a hand-held flare or shot off an aerial flare? These are just some of the skills you'll be able to practice! In addition, you'll be able to "walk through" the use of a passing line to enter a raft-up, practice the mechanics of setting an anchor, reinforce how to safely use a winch, practice tossing a line from one person to another, etc.

This year we'll also have a station on everything you've ever wanted to know about PFDs (personal flotation devices) ...showing the different types, how to maintain them, man overboard poles, whistles, reflectors, lights, personal EPIRBS, etc.

We encourage all members to attend Flare and Safety Day to have a morning outside brushing up on safety skills in preparation for the quickly approaching sailing season!

Dockside Training April 29 & 30

Dockside Training provides an opportunity for new members and rusty members to have an introduction or refresher sailing on with SOS.



You will meet aboard various members' boats for a session structured to simulate an SOS cruise, but not leave the dock. (Sometimes if the weather is good and the boat is ready, you may go out for a day sail.)

Skippers and First Mates will conduct standard pre-cruise and safetv and provide hands-on briefings Dockside Training training. is designed to answer such questions What tasks does the crew as: perform on a boat? How do I tie a clove hitch or stopper knot? What am I expected to do when leaving the dock and more?

You may sign up for a combination of a Day Sail and Dockside Training on Saturday the 29th or a half day of Dockside Training on Sunday the 30th after the Flare Demo. Please indicate your preference when you register using the Event Calendar at www.singlesonsailboats.org.

You will be notified **by email** regarding your boat/skipper assignment. Just pack your water bottle, picnic lunch, and Basic Skills form. Then head to your assigned SOS boat generously offered by an SOS skipper for a day of fun, camaraderie, and learning.

Please update and carry your Medical Information Form!

The need to have an Emergency Medical Information Form on hand when we sail is not something we all like to think about, but in the event of an emergency it could be critical.

SOS developed this form for members to have on hand "just in case." Click here to download from SOS Website: <u>Medical Form</u>

On this form you put information on your emergency contacts, health conditions, medicines you are taking, health insurance information, and contact information for your doctor.... all the information a medical professional might need to care for you in an emergency.

To respect privacy, most club members fill out their form and keep it in a sealed envelope. When they sail, they leave their sealed envelope on the boat's nav station to be turned over to a medical professional in an When the member emergency. completes their sail, they take the sealed envelope back home with them to use again on their next sail. And yes...there have been times when a skipper and crew have been glad they had this information readily available for medical specialists! So, if you haven't been carrying this form on sails...please start. And even if you have been...please make sure it's up to date.

Lastly, please make sure your emergency contact is someone we can call on in an emergency and their phone number is valid seven days a week.

The Annapolis Fire Department EMTs (emergency medical technicians) think this is a great system that could make a big difference for them in handling an emergency!

If you are paying by check for any sailing event, a paper Sailing Registration Form must **accompany the check** mailed to the **coordinator**. A copy of this form can be found on the SOS website. All checks are to be made payable to <u>SOS, Inc.</u> The postmark is used as the mail in cutoff/deadline date. **Note: Individual request for refunds will incur a \$3 Administration Fee.**

AHOY CREW

The SOS io group is the official online communication for SOS members, providing a convenient way for discussion of various sailing related topics. It is also a tool skippers can use to recruit crew for an impromptu day of sailing or to request a boat helper. Need to arrange a carpool to an SOS party – this is a good way to reach out to members.

You can join, leave and rejoin most subgroups without moderator intervention. You can turn on or off emails from any subgroup you are part of and even to the main "All" group. So you could restrict your emails, for example, to only Skippers@sos.groups.io if you were a member of that subgroup. NOTE: Skippers group membership is moderated, and restricted to only be skippers, board members or relevant committee chairs.

Here are the *very simple* steps for you to join the SOS email group.

STEP 1 - Get a groups.io account

1.1 In a browser, go to http://groups.io and click Sign Up in the upper right corner. Follow the directions to register an account email (use the one you get SOS email at).
