

Aground in the Chesapeake: The grounding of the Ever Forward

Mark Hergan will be with us to show images, tools and techniques used to capture everything from international shipping to



Special to his presentation will be select images from "Aground in the Chesapeake, the grounding of the Ever Forward". The 1,095-foot-long Marine Corp. ship carrying 4,964 containers went aground after departing from Port of Baltimore bound for Norfolk, Virginia. The Ever Forward was not freed until April 17.

Mark Hergan is an avid sailor and photographer on the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries. A graduate of St. Mary's College of Maryland and is also a founding member of the college's Offshore Sailing Team. He currently races his Tripp 33 Zombie on Tuesday Nights with Baltimore City Yacht Association and has enjoys the challenge of overnight distance races on the Bay.

He has raced in both the 120 nm Down the Bay and 67nm Governor's Cup races this year on Zombie. Most of his weekends in the summer are spent onboard the 1932 Chesapeake



Bay Log Canoe Mystery as crew, he has even skippered her in a race.

Mark started actively photographing the Chesapeake Bay Yacht Racing

Association (CBYRA) junior sailing regattas the summer of 2014 while traveling the Chesapeake Bay with his son and other members of the North East River Yacht Club's junior sailing team. He could always be found floating around the racing course in his 17' Boston Whaler Montauk taking photos and assisting junior sailors in need. Mark now travels the bay in an 18' Scout CC Sportfish photographing the Chesapeake. The Port of Baltimore and Chesapeake Bay Log Canoes are his favorite subject and he published his first book on Log Canoes January 2017. 


