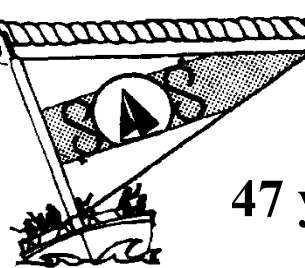

Join your fellow sailors for Brunch on Sunday, November 16 at the DoubleTree Hotel in Annapolis for an entertaining presentation by Gary Jobson.



Gary Jobson is a former All-American collegiate sailor. As a sailor, Gary Jobson has enjoyed a long and successful career in small and large boats. He was twice named **College Sailor of the Year**. He has won many of the world's offshore races, and he was tactician on the winning the **America's Cup** yacht, *Courageous*, in 1977, with skipper Ted Turner.

He started his career as a sailing coach at the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy, and later at the U.S. Naval Academy. Since then, Jobson has authored 23 books on sailing, narrated or produced 1,200 television programs and films, has given over 2,900 lectures, and has competed in 6,000 races.

Jobson spent 31 years with ESPN covering nine America's Cup events and producing many documentaries. He has covered seven Olympics and an America's Cup for NBC, most recently Paris 2024. For his work in television, Jobson has been presented with three Emmys, six Tellys, and an ACE Award.

He was inducted into the National Sailing Hall of Fame (2011) and the America's Cup Hall of Fame (2003) by the Herreshoff Marine Museum. In 1999 he won the Nathanael G. Herreshoff Trophy, US Sailing's most prestigious award.

Beneath the Arctic Ice Courage, Catastrophe, and the Brotherhood of Submariners

Vice Admiral John J. Donnelly, (Ret.) (he goes by Jay) will give a presentation about submarine operations under the Arctic ice pack. He will include one such exercise featuring US and UK submarines in the Arctic, during which a chain of events years in the making resulted in an explosion on the UK boat, costing the life of one sailor, and jeopardizing the lives of all aboard.

He will explain why they train under the ice and the added dangers in that

unique environment. He will also address the remarkable quality of Navy submarine sailors and the level of training they receive to earn their submarine qualification.

Jay will also touch on the life of a career naval officer, drawing on his experience as the son of a submariner and the father of three naval officers. He has agreed to take questions on any aspect of submarine force.

Elinor W. "Elli" Abramson Award for Contributions to SOS Education Programs: Elli Abramson created many new educational programs for the members of Singles on Sailboats. After serving on the Board of Directors for two years, she gradually built an all-encompassing education program that provides the opportunity to broaden one's knowledge of sailing at minimal cost. She transformed the spring education program so that it attracts more participants than any other SOS event. Elli sailed beyond this world in 1992. 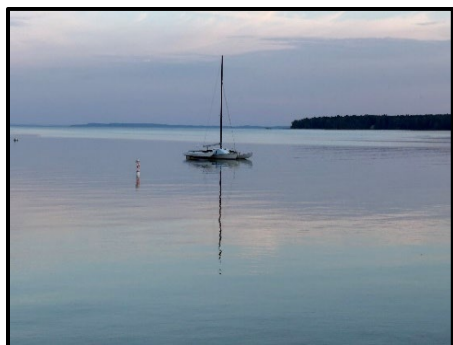

SOS Lake Michigan Cruise

Sept 6-13, 2025

The SOS late summer bareboat cruise got off to a rocky start when the Lake Huron boats ended up in probate. An alternate destination of Lake Michigan was arranged due to the quick thinking, diligence, and determination of the trip coordinator Carole Jordan, Treasurer Janet Pennewell, and Bareboat Co-Chairs Heide Harper and Deb Kauffman (not to mention the SOS Board, who met in emergency session). The departure point, Traverse City, Michigan, proved to be an ideal replacement.

Most people drove to Traverse City, generally stopping on the way out or the way back or both. Stopping places in the USA included Detroit, Cleveland, Ann Arbor, Lockport, Niagara Falls, Lake Chautauqua, and Corning, NY and both Mackinaw City and Mackinac Island on the Michigan upper peninsula. There were Canadian destinations too, including Niagara-on-the Lake and Ontario locales.

Twenty-eight sailors, mainly SOS members with a few friends as additional crew members, convened in Traverse City. The Great Lakes Sailing Company, our charter operator for this trip, provided six sailboats, (35 to 44 feet in length.)

All boats were monohulls built by Jeanneau and Catalina.

The initial briefing for all skippers and first mates was on Friday, Sept 5. Boat-specific briefings were held the next morning immediately before departure.

Traverse City is at the southern end of the Old Mission Peninsula (OMP). The OMP is bracketed by the east and west arms of Grand Traverse Bay, which are both about 20 to 25 nautical miles long and run north-south. Hence on Saturday, Sept 6, all boats headed north. That first day had great wind, 15 to 20 knots, allowing everyone to log a good day's sailing. Most boats stopped that first night in Northport.

Sunday and Monday also had mainly dry weather with at least 15 knots west or southwest wind. Those on deck had to layer clothing to keep warm in the high-50s temperatures and brisk wind. Many boats headed to Petoskey Sunday night, a lovely town with upscale restaurants, jewelry and furniture stores, a well-maintained marina, and a library built by Andrew Carnegie. The healthy winds for three days made for great sailing on the Big Lake!

From Petoskey many boats headed back west through the narrow Round Lake Channel (and under the drawbridge) to Charlevoix, which is famous for its mushroom houses.

These were built in the 20th century by architect and developer Earl Young. Their undulating roof lines and field stone boundary walls are unique.

Young also developed a hotel (Weathervane Terrace Inn & Suites) along the Channel, and a subdivision called Boulder Park. In the latter, Young used large rocks (hence the name "Boulder") to bracket the front doorways and incorporated them into the facades; the same boulder motif graces two large fireplaces inside the Weathervane Inn.

A number of SOSers did a self-guided walking tour (thank you to the stand-in guide Victor Kit and to the local resident who took the time to provide us with substantial background information about the neighborhood and the houses) of these architectural delights. Tuesday evening four of that same group

stumbled on a desk clerk at the Weathervane Inn who kindly showed us the two boulder-clad fireplaces in the Inn and plied us with local details.

Those that swam in Lake Michigan or combed the beaches might have come across Petoskey stones. Both a rock and a fossil, they were formed 350 million years ago and contain fossilized coral. The fossil content isn't always visually apparent; wetting the stone with water made the embedded fossils visible. Some stones were small (fingertip-sized) and some were larger than a fist.

At the Old Mission Inn, crew from Coco's boat looked at a few fist-sized Petoskey stones used by Inn staff as paperweights. No water was needed to highlight their fossil content. The Inn host said one had surprisingly been picked up from the gravel driveway.

In Memory of Walter (Spud) Flowers



Captain Walter Raymond Flowers (Spud), US Navy Retired, a skipper who was the longest-serving member of SOS, passed away October 16th after a fall at Great Falls Park. Spud graduated from the Naval Academy in 1955 and went on to achieve the rank of Captain which is the highest rank possible for his branch of the Navy. He is survived by his son Glen, daughters Karen and Karla, 10 grandchildren, and one great grandson.

Spud's father was a Senior Chief Yeoman stationed at Pearl Harbor during the Japanese attack on December 7, 1942. Spud was seven at the time and remembers seeing the pilots inside the Japanese aircraft as they flew over his house at low altitude. As a senior aide to a high-ranking Naval officer, his father was able to get his family on the first ship out of Hawaii and Spud ended up in San Francisco.

While at the Naval Academy, Spud took flying lessons on the Q.T. at the airport in Edgewater. As a naval officer, Spud worked on communications systems and invented a circular radio-frequency array. One of his assignments was Program Manager of a communications station in Iceland. After retiring from the Navy in 1984, he went on to work for several electronics companies, including TRW, BAE Systems, and Metratek.

Spud is well-known for his active participation in SOS with his Catalina 27, *Liquidity*. In recent years, he fulfilled a long-term desire by building a new house on his lot with several boat slips on an inlet off Mill Creek. Over many years he taught sailing to many, many sailors both in and out of SOS. His long-time friend, Marilyn Goodson, passed away several years ago.

Burial and a service for Spud will be held in the chapel at Arlington National Cemetery sometime in the future.
