Membership Renewal Deadline: Jan 31, 2026 Membership Year: Jan 1 - Dec 31, 2026

Annual membership dues for 2026 will be as follows:

- Regular and Associate Members - \$72
- Lifetime Members \$47
- Inactive/Nonresident Members - \$15

There will be an additional \$51 charge for those wishing a printed copy of the newsletter each month. Note that if you DO want the printed copy, you MUST check the appropriate box on the dues payment form.

These amounts represent a modest 2.9% increase in line with the Consumer Price Increase (CPI) through August 2025 and reflect the increasing costs of almost every aspect of our club – including the cost of running our website, postage, food and beverages for events, facility costs for our shore party locations, and the storage units where we keep our supplies and equipment.

Important note: Although the requested deadline is January 31, the club will honor membership renewals that have been processed by February 28, 2026. After this grace period, memberships that have not been renewed will lapse. Lapsed members that wish to rejoin after February 28 will need to join as new members and pay the \$10 administrative fee charged to members in addition to the regular dues.

This change will lessen the demands on our DataBase team and improve the process for skipper activations for the upcoming sailing season and allow our membership directory to be published earlier. It will also allow members to realize a full year of value for their membership dues.

Four renewal email reminders will be sent to all members: One in late November, one at the end of December, one in the third week of January, and one on January 28th.

Regular, Lifetime, and Inactive Members:

Offline renewal:

- Print, fill out, and mail dues payment (check only) to P.O. Box 5708, Annapolis, MD 21403.

Regular and Lifetime Skipper Members:

 Follow the instructions for Regular and Lifetime members.

- Additionally, enter the application items under the Minimum Required and Overnight Required Equipment.
- If you are no longer a boat owner, you will have the option to change your membership to Regular, Lifetime, or Inactive.

Lifetime Membership Eligibility:

To become a Lifetime member, your date of birth MUST be on or before December 31, 1954, AND you joined SOS BEFORE March 31, 2009. However, if you had a lapse in your Membership since March 31, 2009, you are NOT eligible to become a Life Member.

To change your membership to Life member, you must contact the membership committee to verify your eligibility for Lifetime membership.

Inactive/Nonresident Members:

You are eligible to be an Inactive/Nonresident member if: You live outside of the Chesapeake area and/or have physical or other limitations, and therefore, no longer sail or attend social functions. Inactive members:

- Will not have voting privileges.
- Will not be able to hold elected office.
- Would not have other benefits of membership.
- Could attend social functions only as the guest of a member, or by paying a non-member fee.

<u>Vice Commodore</u>: Karl Scible – Plaques are being gathered from previous awardees. Considering changing the lock on high dollar locker to re-establish control of same. Prepared info package for new Vice Commodore.

As of the end of October, we continue to be comfortably on track to meet our budget projections for the year and expect to end the year with a positive net income.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Bareboat: Deb Kauffman and Heide Harper (1) The Spring New Zealand trip was a great trip! (2) We quickly put together a pretty fantastic trip to Lake Michigan after Lake Huron was canceled. (3) Grenada (March 2026) is well in hand – we just added another boat, chartered from Dream Yachts and skippered by Doug Love, pulling crew partly from the wait list. and (4) We're looking at an Ireland canal trip next September, which received a lot of positive feedback as one of the options surveyed as

a replacement for Lake Huron. Also, we have added a new ACH payment method for Bareboat.

<u>Cruising</u>: Laura Keough and Dana Stoffregen – Weekend Cruise Snapshot: (1) Chili Cook-off to Granary Creek, DNR: 7 Skippers and 16 crew sailed; fun shoreside Chili Cook-off! (2) OysterFest Cruise to CBMM; 7 Skippers and 25 crew sailed. (3) Upcoming Blue Lips Cruise to Pirates Cove Marina; 7 skippers and 13 crew registered. Cruising Wrap-up Party – Nov 15 at Galesville Memorial Hall.

<u>Database</u>: DB Team Lead: Carrie Will — There will be a lot of behind the scenes work for Database to do in November — cleaning up profiles, changing the site to point to the new BOD and new Committee Chairs, and archiving 2025 registrations. The first membership renewal reminder will be sent out around11/26/25.

Education: De facto Chair: Milyn Jordan -Kerry Siebein is coordinating Fireside Chats (FSC). Looking for a volunteer to coordinate Seminars. The Education **Delivery Focus Group** continues to meet to discuss best methods of delivering education to SOS members. Spring Training (a.k.a Education Day) will be paused in 2026 and these alternatives will be offered: (1) A skipper day or half day in mid-to-late March. (2) The Education Committee will partner with Flare and Safety to extend this event to a full day, April 11. (3) A new member orientation and dockside training will be conducted at a marina to include classroom instruction in the morning, on-boat activity in the afternoon, and a social activity at end of day, in late April.

Susan Zevin led an extensive discussion of a small group effort (separate from and in parallel with Milyn's Education efforts) to look at the Basic Skills program, (last updated circa 2010-2011.) References to Basic Skills are explicitly embedded in requirements for daysails, weekend sails, and bareboat trips, directly affecting coordination activities.

Membership: Pat Tracey and Linda Casucci – 4 new members joined SOS in October 2025. Membership is still looking to find a new Chair. Renewals: this year Membership will be making phone calls after January 2026, with a grace period of one month, ending February 2026. We're still looking for 2 volunteers to assist with making phone calls. Membership Recognition Awards: Carrie Will and Rita Svec are receiving Membership Recognition Awards at the November Brunch.

Newsletter: Julie Fort – We are still looking for members to step in if necessary for the Photo and Fleet Exercises editors.

<u>Public Relations</u>: Janet Gonski and Victoria Rusakova – Facilitating a Food Pantry collection at the November brunch. We are also facilitating a new theme for December 13 EYC Lights Parade Caribbean Christmas. We have had 20+ members express interest in working on the volunteer team, with 7+ who are new participants.

<u>Safety</u>: Joan Tannen – Activations have been completed for 2025. Once skippers update their boat information for 2026, I will begin next year's boat activations. Will write a newsletter article on fire blankets versus fire extinguishers. Reminder that Safety needs expired fire extinguishers for next year's Flare and Safety Day. Dates and venues have been set for next year's CPR, Flare and Safety Day, and Dinghy Dance.

<u>Skippers' Advisory</u>: Sandy Rosswork - One area which needs more work is the skipper mentor program. New skippers are often highly accomplished sailors and do not want a "mentor". We have changed the name to "liaison" and emphasized the need to become familiar with SOS policies and procedures. Relevant information is sent and new skippers receive a welcome email. Liaison volunteers have been selected for several areas with concentrations of SOS boats. This is still a work in progress.

Social: Tina Lavato and Kathy McFadden -Chili Cook-off on Oct 18th went well, though attendance was down from last year. A total of 53 members registered - 35 opting for both the cruise and shore party and 18 opting for shore party only. Halloween Party October 31st was cancelled due to the low registrations. We will be asking for ideas for next year and welcome any feedback. Two events have been scheduled for 2026 with the same venue as last year: Spring DNR: May 15-17, and Seafood Feast: Aug.15-16. We aim to have the Anniversary Party on June 20th, pending securing a location (Port Annapolis has changed ownership; Maryland Yacht Club is a possible venue).

New Business: Skipper Emeritus status has been awarded to John Halstead, who joined the club in 1994 and sailed his boat, *Drambuie*, with SOS for close to 30 years. John served as club Commodore (1999-2000) and was instrumental in starting the club's very successful bareboat program. John took many club members out on the water and has always been willing to help with advice and suggestions for those who followed him in SOS leadership positions.

Beneath Arctic Ice:

Courage, Catastrophe, and the Brotherhood of Submariners

December 14th Brunch


Admiral John J. Donnelly (Ret.) (who goes by Jay) will give a presentation about submarine operations under the Arctic ice pack. He will share one exercise featuring US and UK submarines in the Arctic, during which a chain of events years in the making resulted in an explosion on the UK boat, costing the life of one sailor and jeopardizing the lives of all aboard.

He will also discuss why they train under the ice, the added dangers in that unique environment, the remarkable quality of submariner sailors, and the level of training they receive to earn their submarine qualification. Admiral Donnelly will also touch on his life as a career naval officer, drawing on his experience as the son of a submariner and the father of three naval officers.

He has agreed to take questions on any aspect of submarine force.

Ospreys on the Patuxent

January 11th Brunch

Roughly one-fourth of the ospreys in continental U.S. nest Chesapeake Bay. Ospreys suffered massive declines in the 1950's and 60's due to widespread use of the pesticide DDT. A Maryland avian ecologist Alex Pellegrini, will discuss with us the current state of osprevs (Pandion Haliaetus), commonly known as "fish hawks," in the Patuxent River and the Chesapeake Bay. Alex will discuss osprey biology, his experiences banding ospreys, reintroduction efforts, and how this once-imperiled bird became conservation success story.

Pellegrini is the Farmland Raptor Program Coordinator with Maryland Bird Conservation Partnership. Alex leads statewide efforts to expand nesting opportunities for American Kestrels and American Barn Owls, while also studying Short-eared Owls with a focus on taxonomy, behavior, and conservation across Maryland.

Beyond these roles, Alex manages datasets for Operation Osprey, ensuring the integrity and accessibility of their data to support science-based conservation. He also serves on the Maryland/D.C. Records Committee of the Maryland Ornithological Society and is a lead bander at the Project Owlnet station in Frederick, MD. He is also involved in several international collaborations.

Outside of work, he's an avid birder who enjoys exploring new habitats and keeping an eye out for the unexpected.

He earned his B.S. from Towson University in 2022, double-majoring in Conservation Biology and Animal Behavior.

Submit photos in high resolution. The photos will be enlarged to 5" x 7" (and larger to project to a screen). If the photo is fuzzy, it reduces your chance of winning. Photos not submitted in the 5" x 7" format will be cropped to that format. Smart phone photos may be submitted. Please select high resolution for photos in your smart phone setup.

NOTE: The 2025 SOS Photo Contest WILL ALLOW some editing for the first time. Final contest rules are on the SOS website. Search for "2025 Photo Contest."

Update on SOS Education

A hallmark of SOS is a commitment to safety and education. The SOS Education Committee is focused on identifying and scheduling educational events for members to enjoy during the non-sailing season – including Spring Training, Seminars, and Fireside Chats. Additionally, Education sometimes partners with other SOS committees for special events.

This fall, the SOS Board discussed and approved a focus group to explore potential improvements in the ways that SOS delivers its education program. The Education Delivery Focus Group is made up of the following SOS members: Irene Aronian, Gabe Ruiz, Karen Lungren, Barb Wise, Dana Tulis, Carole Jordan, Mindy Kinsey, and Milyn Jordan. The group considered Spring Training survey results and metrics as well as considerable informal feedback from SOS members. Discussions were enthusiastic and lively!

The annual Spring Training has been an ongoing, well attended SOS event. But Spring Training takes place at a time of year when both members and vendors/presenters are all rushing to get boats back in the water. This, combined with the costs continually escalating venues, led the group to thoughts about trying some alternative approaches.

After input and thoughtful evaluation, here's a roadmap of SOS Education for 2026:

- Spring Training will be paused in 2026. This will provide an opportunity to experiment with alternatives
- Seminars and Fireside Chats will continue to be held. Planning and scheduling for these is underway.
- A new event, Skipper Education Day, will be specifically focused on Skippers, First Mates, and our experienced sailors who require advanced education commensurate with their roles. This event is currently in the planning stage. It is planned to occur in the first quarter of 2026.
- Flare and Safetv (F&S). sponsored by the Safety Committee, is intended for all SOS Members. The Education Committee will partner with the Safety Committee to expand this event to include additional stations.
- A full day event is planned for new members, current members who are looking for a refresh, and potential members interested in joining SOS.

The event will include two sections, a morning classroom orientation and an afternoon spent at a nearby marina, reviewing basic skills at multiple "boat stations." This event provides the opportunity to learn and to review the basic skills needed to be a contributing member of a boat crew.

So, What Are the Annual Awards?

He was one of those unique individuals who shared his joy of sailing with you. Ed sailed beyond this world in 1987. Nominations for the award come from the general membership.

Elinor W. "Elli" Abramson Award for Contributions to SOS Education Programs: Elli Abramson created many new educational programs for the members of Singles on Sailboats. Database Answers to Frequently Asked Questions

Q1: Why does our calendar page have two entries for an event?

A: We want the public to see all that we have to offer:

One entry is for members only. It can't be seen by the public and provides a direct link to a registration form. The second entry is seen by everyone and does not contain links or personal data.

Q2: Why do we have to log in twice?

A: You don't necessarily! You are logging in to two different URLs to get to the same database.

Singlesonsailboats.org is our "public-facing" website domain. It has a member login for seeing details that are only privy to SOS members such as your profile, Forms & Such, and a calendar with clickable links.

ss.memberclicks.net is our member management software site – a subdomain under MemberClicks – and it is restricted for security reasons. You log in to this site when you register for an event. You may access the event via the calendar page or directly via a link from the Weekly Updates email. Once you are logged in here, you can sign up for multiple events without logging in again.

When passwords don't seem to work between the two, it might be a cache problem. Log in to https://ss.memberclicks.net with your username and password. If the password does not work, use the Reset Password option here to create a new one.
