Morning Group Sessions Include:

- **Safety Second!** Presented by **Captain John Schafer**. Captain Schafer is a globally recognized safety innovator, offshore sailor, and team-building expert with over 40 years of experience in high-risk leadership. As a U.S. Army veteran and one of the first Humanitarian Security Officers, he has advised global Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) and government leaders on how to lead and respond under pressure — from war zones to regattas. He helped shape international safety initiatives such as the UN's "Saving Lives Together" and the White House Office of Hostage Affairs and founded the International NGO Safety and Security Association.

Today, as a certified US Sailing Safety at Sea Moderator and a trusted voice on YouTube, Schafer brings proven crisis leadership tools to crews, companies, and organizations worldwide. This presentation considers the following: *"Without leadership, Safety will not be a core value!"* In sailing, strong leadership must come first because the captain

is responsible for assessing weather, navigating hazards, and making decisive commands that prevent disasters before they arise. Safety, while critical, is inherently secondary as it stems directly from the leader's foresight, crew training, and resource management—without these, even the best safety protocols falter. Ultimately, prioritizing leadership ensures that safety is not just a checklist but a natural outcome of competent guidance on the unpredictable seas.

- **How to Interpret Forecasts** presented by **Alan Miller**. Alan is a maritime professional, educator, and organizational leader with decades of experience in vessel operations, training, and program development. He serves in senior leadership at the Annapolis School of Seamanship, where he oversees maritime education programs, logistics, and professional partnerships while also teaching both basic and advanced marine weather forecasting. He holds a Penn State Weather Forecasting Certificate and brings extensive real-world, underway experience to weather instruction, translating theory into practical decision-making on the water. His background includes commercial and instructional sea time, including qualification as a Royal Yachting Association (RYA) 200T Commercial Skipper, and years of on-the-job operational training aboard a wide range of vessels. Alan is known for a calm, mission-focused approach, strong work ethic, and an ability to build systems that support safe, competent mariners in demanding environments.

The one-hour presentation introduces practical marine weather tools used by professional mariners and offshore sailors. The session will cover how to interpret forecasts and products from the Ocean Prediction Center and the National Weather Service, with an emphasis on real-world decision-making underway. Attendees will also learn how to effectively use the Predicting app to compare models, assess risk, and plan safer passages. (Continued on page 4.)

Ahoy Sailors,

Our January Brunch was a great success with our featured speaker Alex Pellegrini, who delivered an informative and highly entertaining presentation on the life and behavior of the Osprey. Alex explained that a significant portion of the global osprey population can be found along the Patuxent River.

Alex discussed his work banding ospreys to track their migration patterns and lifespans—which can exceed 25 years. Alex noted that osprey populations have declined over time, which has led to efforts to install nesting towers along the river. With a great sense of humor and stunning action photographs, Alex kept the audience engaged throughout his talk. He even shared a personal story of a close encounter while banding a young osprey, when a protective mother swooped down and tore his T-shirt—leaving him with a memorable scar.

In February, Regional Brunches will be held in members' homes in several areas where our members live. (See page 5 for more information.) There will not be a brunch in March due to the Grenada bareboat trip. As noted below, the next brunch will be at the DoubleTree in Annapolis on April 12th, where the 2025 Retrospective and the results of the SOS Photo Contest will be presented, followed by a general meeting for all members.

On January 2nd, we had another very productive and engaging Board of Director/Committee Co-Chair meeting. Some of the highlights include there are 55 applicants for the Ireland Canal Barge bareboat trip in September 2026, this is one of our most popular trips.

The budget for 2026 was passed with the understanding that we need to raise the cruising fees to \$25 per day to ensure the Club's budget is not in the "red" next year. In fact, it does appear that overall the club was slightly in the "red" for 2025. As noted before, our expenses have increased while income was reduced, creating a gap.

The Education Committee has planned a "Skilled Sailor Education Day" for skippers, First Mates, and experienced members on February 28. The Education Committee is working on the April 11 "Flare and Safety Day", to include more stations. The Education Committee is also working on a day-long event for April 25. It is tailored for members looking for a refresher, as well as newbies or novice sailors. It's called "Welcome Aboard: From Dock to Deck" and features educational sessions in the morning followed by lunch. In the afternoon, small groups will visit some of our SOS boats at Castle Marina for hands-on, dockside training with skippers and First Mates.

The Database Team continues its impressive accomplishments including backing up invoices from 2025, updating active member and prospective member profiles, and media manager files. The Cruising Committee is finalizing the sailing calendar for 2026, and the Social Committee is actively identifying sites for our events. At our next meeting, we will delve further into the Action Items from our December Retreat.

After the Committee Chair meeting, there was a closed Board of Directors meeting, where we discussed nominees for the SOS awards, for those volunteers that work long hours, with major accomplishments, ensuring the success of SOS. Those awards will be presented at the April 12th Brunch in Annapolis, along with the photographic retrospective and photography awards, Committee Chair updates, and general membership feedback.

I continue to be impressed by the work of our Board and Committee Chairs/Co-Chairs. They keep this club running, but we still need some help: our Membership Chair will be vacant at the end of February. Please consider volunteering as you enjoy our off-season events!!

The next Board of Directors/Committee Chairs meeting is Feb. 5.

Full year 2025 results are not yet available. We are likely to fall somewhat short of our full-year budget of \$1,270.

The balance in our club checking account increased as dues payments for 2026 began to come in.

The Bareboat Account decreased as we made the final payments on all but one of the boats for Grenada. The final Grenada payment is due this month. At the same time, our credit card balance increased as we made deposits on the first 4 boats for Ireland.

There was discussion about the **SOS Directory** and associated costs. More about that in the Database report.

2026 Budget APPROVED: Dana Tulis made the motion to approve, seconded by Richard Cordaro. Unanimously approved by the Board.

Committee Reports:

Bareboat: Deb Kauffman and Heide Harper report that there are 55 applicants for the fall Ireland Canal trip, Carrick-on-Shannon to Portumna bareboat trip in September 2026 with Doug Gage as coordinator. The committee report illustrates and

documents a proposed **change to the Admin Fee for participants.**

Brunch: Margaret Schwartz. The November and December brunches went very well with 75+ attendees. The next brunch is January 11th. There will be no March brunch due to the Spring Skipper and New Member events being held. April brunch will require a new contract with the DoubleTree hotel since this is a new fiscal year for the facility. Brunch registration should be open to non-members. This was noted by Carrie Will for adjusting the sign-up form/procedure.

Cruising: Laura Keough and Dana Stoffregen, Co-chairs.

2026 Cruising Season Planning

Schedule: Review survey results and develop calendar to be reviewed by skippers & Board – January. Finalize calendar and post in *Whisker Pole* – February 15. Cruising kickoff – April 18th at Galesville Memorial Hall. Cruising Wrap-up Party - November 15 at Galesville Memorial Hall.

2026 Spring Extended Sail is May 23–June 6; Northbound trip with 1-week & 2-week options. Zoom call for planning team 7pm, January 7.

SOS Policies Update: Cruising committee is working on a revision of the SOS policies to be consistent with the current cruising operations. It will be presented to the board when the proposed revision is completed.

Cruising Awards: Ray Harris has won the 2026 most sailed skipper award. Cruising will order his personalized shirt.

Education: Milyn Jordan.

Kerry Siebein has confirmed six **Fireside Chats** including one each in Philadelphia and Springfield, VA.

The Education Committee is looking for a volunteer to coordinate **Seminars.**

The Education Delivery Focus Group continues to meet to discuss the best methods of delivering

education to SOS members. The next meeting will be January 14th.

Skilled Sailors Education Day (for experienced sailors, Skippers, and First Mates) is February 28.

Welcome Aboard: Dock to Deck Day is April 25th for beginning sailors, new members, and interested potential new members.

First Mates: Lora Donia & Jean-Pierre Plé, Co-Chairs. Candidate Coordinator is John Parsons.

Committee Formation: The newly reestablished First Mate Advisory Committee is in the process of being finalized, pending confirmation of members. Once formed, the committee will begin a comprehensive review and update of all First Mates Materials expected to be posted on the SOS website in early 2026.

First Mate Training and Education Teleconferences are tentatively scheduled for Spring, Summer, and Fall. Planned topics include Club expectations of First Mates and best practices; Transiting Knapp's Narrows and Kent Island Narrows; Inland Rules day shapes; Night, dusk, and low visibility sailing, including buoy light characteristics and vessel lighting requirements under Inland Rules.

Checkout Skipper Review: A meeting is tentatively planned for the third week in January to review the current list of First Mate Checkout Skippers and to add newly approved skippers.

Recruitment and Program Development: Recruitment of new First Mates remains a priority. The committee will focus on strengthening the program to better meet the needs of the club. This includes reviewing current certification requirements, identifying opportunities to streamline the process, updating the First Mate checkout form, and developing and implementing additional training and education sessions.

The focus is on translating weather information into clear, actionable choices for sailors.

Afternoon Breakout Sessions Include:

- **Electronic Navigation and Radar.** Presented by SOS's own **Harry Keith**. Harry is a long-time SOS skipper who has, with his wife Kati, cruised their Saga 43 over 10,000 miles in the last 5 years, including far north portions of Canada. He is a retired U.S. Navy Surface Warfare Officer. He will lead a 45-minute discussion on Electronic Navigation and Radar, including purpose-built devices, computer-based navigation, and cell phone apps. Benefits, concerns, compromises, tricks, and real-world stories will be shared. Questions and participant interests are welcome.
- **Advanced Sail Trim.** Presented by **Frank Mummert**. Frank has been with the Maryland School of Sailing for more than ten years where he teaches basic through ocean sailing courses. He currently holds a USCG 100-ton Ocean Master License. Frank is certified as an ASA Master Instructor, meaning that he can certify other instructors, and is qualified to teach all ASA keelboat courses from 101 up through 108 and all the ASA endorsement courses. Frank earned the ASA Outstanding Instructor Award for the years 2016 and 2022. This 45-minute discussion will help you get the most out of a sail.

Additional Options for Afternoon Breakout Sessions:

- Bareboat Skipper Panel moderated by SOS Skipper Coco Lanquetuit. This panel of SOS Skippers with significant bareboat experience will discuss **elements of skippering a bareboat cruise** including crew selection, planning the itinerary, provisioning, and leading a fun and successful onboard, multi-day experience.
- Bring Your Own Experience (BYOE) **Discussion on Docking/Mooring/Anchoring** facilitated by SOS Skipper Karen Lundgren. Come prepared to share your experience and listen to your peers. This session will present real life scenarios and evaluate what worked, what did not work, and what might have been done different.

Barge Trip In Ireland

September 5, 2026

The SOS Fall 2026 Bareboat trip will be a seven-day (September 5 – 12) cruise down the River Shannon, from Carrick-on-Shannon to Portumna. It's about 100 miles (160 kilometers), with a cruising time of about 20 hours, including 5 locks and 2 bridges, and a half-dozen-plus villages and towns worthy of exploration along the way.

Close to 70 people have already signed up (or at least expressed strong interest), and this promises to be one of the largest SOS Bareboat events ever — we will have between 9 and 12 boats in our "flotilla."

But IT IS NOT TOO LATE to sign up as crew, and we could possibly use another skipper or two.

Because this is a river trip on power boats, only minimal boating skills and experience are necessary, and the principal fitness requirement is to be able to safely get on and off the boat.

This will be an inexpensive trip. SOS will collect only \$1,000 from each participant, and after-trip refunds will vary, reflecting actual per-person boat costs that will depend on the

size and "classiness" of each boat and the number of crew. Additional costs will include fuel and provisioning.

Our starting and ending points are each only about a 2-hour drive from the airports in Dublin (DUB) and Shannon (SNN). Le Boat can arrange transportation to/from either of the airports. Nonstop flights are available to Dublin (and seasonally to Shannon) from all major East Coast airports from Washington up to Boston - roundtrip fares currently range from \$550 to \$700.

The charter company is Le Boat, whom we used for our very successful French canal trips in 2015 and 2021. They operate in Ireland as "Emerald Star," and they offer a wide range of boats.

If you are interested in joining the cruise as either crew OR SKIPPER, here are some steps to take:

Drawing on his distinguished career at sea and his deep respect for America's maritime heritage, Hallett brings history vividly to life. His latest work, *Rewinning the Revolution: The Misunderstood War of 1812*, explores the paradoxes of the War of 1812 — a conflict that changed everything while settling nothing.

Most of us learned in **Economics 101** the fact that **Trade Creates Wealth – Both parties are better off after a fair trade.**

Moving things by sea was the key since roads were few and far between. Thousands of American ships traded around the world and American steamboats were operating on U.S. rivers.

The second major fact was that Britain had no intention of granting American independence at sea. That would be an unwelcome surprise to the British along with superior U.S. Navy frigates and several thousand American privateers swarming around their home islands. It is an interesting tale of how they finally decided we should be friends.

Training in CPR/AED and First Aid for Mariners

Back by popular demand on Saturday, March 7th, we are holding this important training session before the season begins to help us learn these essential skills. The Annapolis Fire Department emergency medical personnel will conduct this hands-on class on CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation), the use of the Automated External Defibrillator (AED), and first aid with a special focus on mariners. The training will be held at the Taylor Avenue Fire Station in Annapolis. (Annapolis Fire Department, Company 38, 620 Taylor Ave., Annapolis, MD 21401).

Because SOS recognizes the value of this American Heart Association certified training, the club pays half the cost. Whether you are learning these techniques for the first time, or recertifying, there is always more to learn. Recommended procedures are always being updated.

Certifications are valid for two years. The class will start at 9:00am and run to approximately 3:00pm. Your cost is \$48.00, which includes coffee and a light breakfast, as well as lunch. Be sure to sign up early because we need to limit attendance.

PR Focus for 2026: We are asking for input from skippers and other members on ways to feel more supported in the club and encouraged to continue club membership.

Safety: Joan Tannen and Michael Sommer, Co-Chairs. The annual **CPR and First Aid for Mariners training** is coming up in March.

Co-Chairs have plans to write a *Whisker Pole* article on **man overboard (MOB) drills** in the next month or so. We are researching MOB

videos from professional organizations such as the Coast Guard and Boat US. Education and Safety committees have plans to add a few more stations to **Flare and Safety Day**. We plan to start activating boats in March.

Two top priorities for Safety this upcoming season are to stress the importance of wearing PFDs (Lifejackets) and to familiarize members on man overboard (MOB) practices.

Skippers' Advisory: Sandra Rosswork. No new skippers have joined the club during the past month. Input has been received about the proposed revisions to the Basic Skills Program and a report made within the upcoming month. Skippers' Advisory Committee worked with the Education Committee to provide input and speaker suggestions for the Skilled Sailor Education Day.

Volunteer Recognition at Brunches and other events (all BOD/Committee Chairs/Co-Chairs).

Member Criteria – Develop a survey of all members to determine whether to open the BOD to single members who have married after joining SOS. And, to broaden membership to include single sailors, who may be married, but sail solo. (Paul Anderson, Irene Aronian, & Barbara Wise).

Look at the SOS Facebook site to expand membership. (Emil Becker and Victoria Rusakova).

Retention of Documentation. Evaluate current retention timeframes and determine if it makes sense to modify them; examine drop box or other options to replace flash drive storage. (Dana Tulis, Janet Pennewell, Paul Anderson, Irene Aronian, and Janet Gonski). Carrie Will is continuing to save files and organize minutes, articles of incorporation, etc.

Treasurer Back-up: Put note in *Whisker Pole* and find other opportunities to recruit.

SOS Membership Chair Needed

Roles and Responsibilities

Chair(s) Monthly Roles:

- Write a monthly report to present to the Board of Directors. The report is usually emailed to all the Board Members to preview before the actual meeting.
- Attend the monthly Board meetings either in person or zoom.

Committee Roles:

Brunch Greeters. Recruit 1 or 2 committee members to participate at the brunch check-in table to welcome new and/or prospective members. Pair them with a seasoned member, who will introduce the new and/or prospective member to other members during the social hour. If there is room at the seasoned member's table include the new or prospective member.

Membership Renewal Coordinator. Oversee the membership renewal process which requires recruiting helpers to make follow-up phone calls, texts, or emails for renewal reminders. This occurs in the beginning of February of any year. Develop a basic telephone script for the renewal reminders and instruct helpers to report back with the member's feedback. Any member who doesn't pay their annual dues by the grace period ending on February 28 will be charged an additional \$10 to renew their membership.

SOS Voice Message and Email Responder: Respond to a message left on SOS's phone message box or email contact box. SOS's phone # 410-798-4098, email contact is info@singleonsailboats.org. This process is through "Ring Central" which will pop up as a text and email.

New Member Manual and Materials: If needed, update the New Member manual and materials which are either emailed or mailed to new members when they join SOS.

New Member Welcome Email and Packet Coordinator:

The Coordinator sends out an email to each new member welcoming him/her to the club. This email includes instructions on how to implement the New Member Sailing Voucher, Happy Hour information, and any other event information that is pertinent for the new member to be aware of and attend. Additionally, two documents are attached to the email which are the **New Member Manual** and **Medical Form**.

New Member Packet Materials: The packet includes a current Directory, and Basic Skills Manual. Regular postage is used. The coordinator is responsible for keeping on hand enough copies of the Basic Skills Manual to be placed in the packet and mailed. Receipts for postage and printing are necessary for reimbursement purposes. When several receipts have been collected fill out the SOS reimbursement form and email it to the current Treasurer.

Updating and Printing the SOS Annual Directory - completed by Rita Svec:

A Coordinator is responsible to find a member who knows how to update SOS's membership database and work with the Database Chair. It is very important to ensure changes to the by-laws are included in the revised Directory. Locate a Company who will print "x" number of Directories and mail them out to the members. Usually the mail out time frame is June-July.

New Member Contact/Area

Contact Coordinator: New Member Contacts are also known as "Area Contacts." These are members who live in a specific area. The coordinator will call or email each Area Contact before the beginning of the new club year to confirm that the Area Contact would like to continue with their responsibilities. The Area Contact receives a monthly list from the Database Chair. If a new member lives in the Area Contact's region, the Area Contact will communicate with the new member welcoming him/her into the club, answering questions and encouraging the new member to

attend Happy Hours and other events.

New Member Mentor Program Coordinator:

The coordinator automatically receives the new member's information when that new member joins SOS. The coordinator emails the new member welcoming him/her to the club and asks if the new member knows a current seasoned SOS member. If so, the coordinator will reach out to that member requesting they act as a mentor to the new member. If the new member doesn't know a current seasoned SOS member, then the coordinator will find a mentor for the new member.

The question is what is the role of a mentor? Essentially a mentor assists the new member in the "How to" ways of SOS. For example, how to sign up for a sail and when to sign up for a sail (early). Encourage him/her to review and practice the Basic Skills exercises. Encourage him/her to attend activities and point out events specifically for new members, for example, Dockside Training. Basically, a mentor is someone the new member can call on with questions and advice.

Volunteer Recognition Program

Coordinator: The Coordinator provides the Volunteer Recognition form to any SOS member who expresses the desire to recognize another member for their volunteer efforts. There are four categories to consider; they are 1) Jump in Whenever; 2) Keeps SOS Afloat; 3) Above and Beyond; and 4) Extraordinaire. The completed form is emailed to the coordinator. The Chair(s) and coordinator review the form and present the information to the Board of Directors. The recognized member's name is featured in the WP with a write up of their efforts.

There are already a few committee members that handle much of the committee's work. If you would consider being the Chair or Co-Chair of Membership, please contact Dana Tulis at danatulis2@verizon.net

If you are paying by check for any sailing event, a paper Sailing Registration Form must **accompany the check** mailed to the **coordinator**. A copy of this form can be found on the SOS website. All checks are to be made payable to **SOS, Inc.** The postmark is used as the mail in cutoff/deadline date.

Note: Individual request for refunds will incur a \$3 Administration Fee.

SOS Wellness Protocol Revised (3/7/2024)
