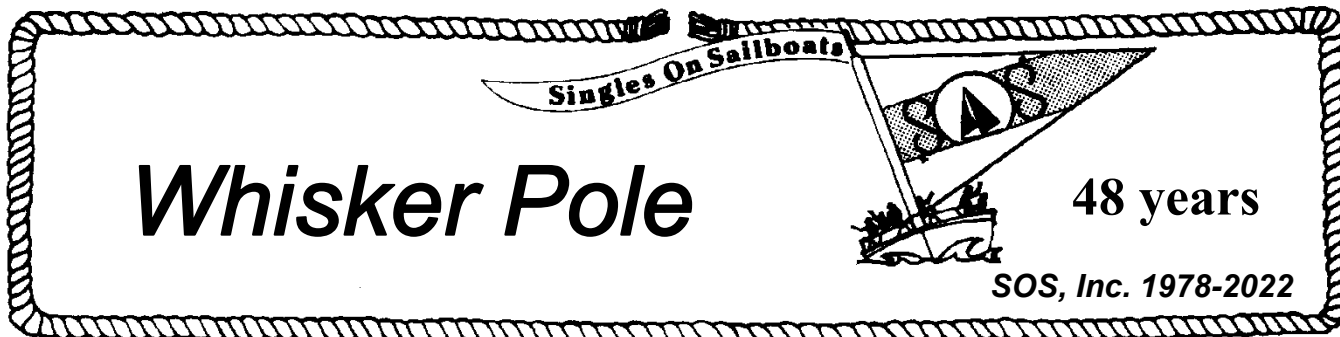

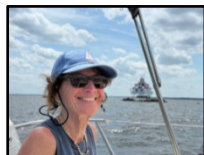

July Board of Directors Meeting. The July Board of Directors meeting focused on election planning, the upcoming membership survey, and the storage lockers cascading costs.

As noted above, the Nominating Committee identifying members to run for the Board of Directors. We established the Election Committee and thank you to those volunteers that will be tallying the votes.

Janet Pennewell presented the latest version of the Full Membership Survey which will be released to all members after the August 1st Town Hall Meeting. Your Commodore had fun, rapping the names of prior Commodores, enjoying a great dinner, catching up with friends, and dancing the night away.

First Mates' Deck Notes:

Encountering Fog on the Chesapeake Bay

This past summer, I completed an amazing two-week extended sailing trip on the Chesapeake Bay and gained a renewed appreciation for the challenges of navigating in fog.

Our journey began on the Chester River as we headed north toward Love Point and eventually our anchorage in Still Pond Creek. While we expected some morning fog, it quickly became apparent that the conditions were much worse than anticipated. Visibility was extremely limited, making it difficult to see other vessels and landmarks.

To minimize risk, we stayed clear of the shipping channel and followed the shoreline, carefully monitoring our depth to avoid running aground. Although we could not see the large cargo ships transiting the Bay, we could hear their fog signals echoing through the mist — a sobering reminder that they were nearby.

One of the most important lessons from the experience was the need to sound the proper fog signals. We diligently used our air horn every two minutes, as required. Before long, however, we discovered that the air horn canister was empty. Realizing we needed to reassess the situation, we decided to make our way to nearby Tolchester Marina and wait for conditions to improve.

Know the Inland Rules

The U.S. Coast Guard Navigation Rules and Regulations and COLREGS handbook under The Inland Rules require all vessels, including those at anchor, in or near an area of restricted visibility, whether by day or night, to sound specific signals. See Inland Rule 35.

A sailing vessel, defined to mean any vessel under sail, provided that propelling machinery, if fitted, is not

being used, whether making way or stopped and making no way through the water must sound one prolonged blast (4-6 seconds' duration) followed by two short blasts (about a 1 second duration) every two minutes or less. See Inland Rule 35(c).

A power-driven vessel making way through the water must sound one prolonged blast every two minutes or less. See Inland Rule 35(a).

A power-driven vessel underway but stopped and making no way through the water must sound two prolonged blasts every two minutes. See Inland Rule 35(b).

These signals help other vessels determine what type of vessel they are hearing and how it is operating.

Our experience highlighted another important lesson: always carry a backup sound-signaling device, i.e. air horn, whistle, bell, gong. Had the fog persisted longer, we would have needed an alternative way to comply with the rules and alert nearby vessels to our presence. Thankfully, we had a whistle as our back up sound-signaling device, which would have been a permitted alternative under Rule 36.

After a couple of hours, the fog began to lift, and visibility improved significantly. We resumed our voyage with greater confidence and continued safely to our destination.

The experience reinforced several important principles of seamanship: prepare for conditions to be worse than forecast; carry backup signaling devices; maintain situational awareness; monitor Automatic Identification System (AIS) and radar whenever available; and never hesitate to alter plans when safety is at stake. Fog can transform a familiar

waterway into an entirely different environment, but patience and careful decision-making can help ensure a safe and successful passage.

Lessons Learned:

- Carry at least two sound-signaling devices.
- Review restricted visibility signal requirements before every trip.
- Reduce speed and maintain a proper lookout.
- Use radar and AIS (Automatic Identification System) whenever available.
- Stay clear of commercial shipping channels when possible.
- Don't hesitate to seek safe harbor and wait for conditions to improve.

Sometimes the safest decision is not to push forward, but to pause, regroup, and continue when conditions allow.

Mnemonics:

Helpful memory aids for power-driven vessels, courtesy of Jean-Pierre Plé:

"Sounding ONE, here I come."

Inland Rule 35(a): A power-driven vessel making way through the water shall sound ONE prolonged blast at intervals of not more than two minutes.

"I'm waiting TOO long."

Inland Rule 35(b): A power-driven vessel underway but stopped and not making way through the water shall sound TWO prolonged blasts at intervals of not more than two minutes.

Safety Committee: New Label System for PFDs

Did you know the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) transitioned from the old "Type I-V" system to a "Performance Level" system (Levels, 50, 70, 100, 150, and 275) to align with international safety standards (implemented in 2025). The new Performance Levels correspond to the upward buoyance force (in Newtons) exerted on a body in a fluid:

- Lower-level numbers offer greater mobility and comfort with good flotation.
- Higher level numbers offer greater flotation, self-turning ability, and stability in the water.

Here is how the new PFD labeling system works:

- **Type I / Level 275: Offshore life jackets.** The highest level of buoyancy PFDs that are exclusively inflatable or hybrid models primarily used by industrial, commercial, and offshore oil rigs. Extreme capability to turn an unconscious person face-up rapidly.
- **Type I / Level 150: Offshore life jackets.** Designed for open ocean, rough water, and extended survival; provides high flotation and self-turning ability.
- **Type II / Level 100: Near-shore vests.** Intended for coastal waters where quick rescue is expected; some turning ability; more comfortable and affordable than offshore models.
- **Type III / Level 70: Flotation aids.** For inland waters; the most popular type for recreational water sports and fishing; not designed to turn an unconscious wearer face-up. Comfortable for all-day wear.
- **Type IV: Throwable devices.** Ring buoys, horseshoe buoys, and buoyant cushions for emergency use, which are designed to be

thrown to a person overboard. Not worn. Must be accessible.

- **Type V / Level 50: Special-use devices.** For near-shore waters where rescue is immediate. Include belt-pack inflatables, float coats, and deck suits. Restricted to specific activities listed on the label; must be worn (not just carried) to be legal on a vessel; no self-turning ability.

In addition, the new labeling system includes:

- **Icons** showing the "Level Number" (50, 70, 100, 150, or 275); the Turning ability of the PFD; and the activities "Not Approved" for it.

- **Panels** that list the Size (body weight and chest size designed for); Maintenance (inspection and storage practices); and a USCG Certification panel.

Both "Type I-V" and "Performance" labeling systems will appear on PFDs during the transition period. Note that existing PFDs with "Type I-V" labels remain fully legal and USCG-compliant. **You do not need to replace your PFDs if they are in good condition.**

Remember, a PFD only works when worn. BE SAFE!

SOS Wellness Protocol Revised (3/7/2024)

All participants attending SOS in-person events should be feeling well. They should not attend an event if they have symptoms of a communicable respiratory or gastrointestinal illness, are "feeling like something is coming on," have a recent significant exposure to someone with a communicable respiratory or gastrointestinal illness, or have not waited a recommended isolation time after a recent respiratory or gastrointestinal infection. In addition, a skipper/host may have further requirements or request other preventive measures (for example, crew or guests having received the currently recommended COVID-19 vaccine or wearing masks when below deck). All in-person participants should expect to be denied admission without a refund if they fail to comply with this policy.

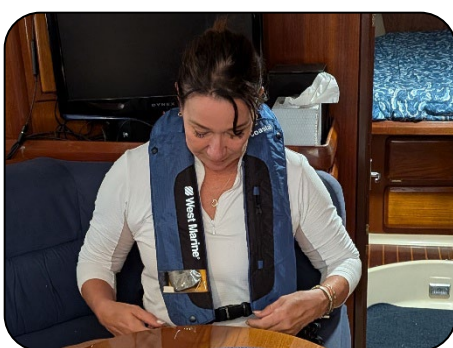

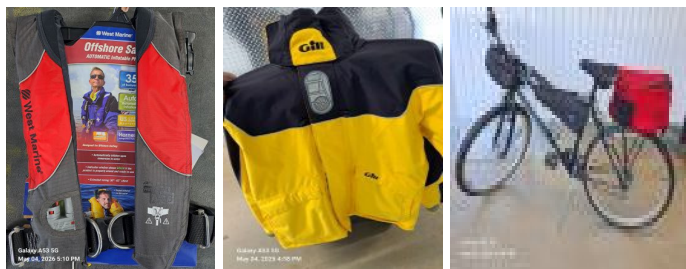
